TREATY ACTION AND IMPLEMENTATION

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I. Overview

This article documents governmental activity undertaken to implement New Zealand's international obligations during the current interval.¹ It concludes that the level of activity in the current interval, relative to the previous interval,² has decreased for the parliamentary, executive and judicial branches of government. This overview summarises that activity and compares it with the activity undertaken during the previous interval.

A. Parliamentary Activity

1. Acts of Parliament

During the current interval, Parliament enacted 46 bills with implications for New Zealand's international obligations. Thirty-seven simply amended Acts that had implemented treaties, four improved compliance with treaties that had already been implemented and five implemented seven new agreements (and aspects of two other previously implemented agreements). Forty-three of these bills involved multilateral agreements, two involved recommendations and one involved a bilateral agreement.

In terms of Acts, this level of activity is less than the previous interval. During the previous interval, Parliament enacted 58 bills with implications for New Zealand's international obligations. Fifty-three simply amended Acts that had implemented treaties, two improved compliance with treaties that had already been implemented and three implemented three new agreements. Fifty-three of these bills involved multilateral agreements, two involved bilateral agreements, two involved a set of recommendations and one involved a code.³

2. Treaty Examination Reports

During the current interval, the House of Representatives considered ten select committee reports on treaties (11 agreements in all and one withdrawal proposal). Six reports brought matters to the attention of the House. Public submissions did not feature in these reports and none warranted a Government response.

In terms of reports, this level of activity is more than during the previous interval (seven more reports). In terms of agreements examined, this level of activity is also more than during the previous interval (eight more agreements). During the previous interval, the House of Representatives considered three select committee reports on treaties (three agreements in all). All three reports brought matters to the attention of the House. Public submissions did not feature in these reports, and none warranted a Government response.⁴

B. Executive Activity

1. Regulations

During the current interval, the Executive made 38 regulations relevant to New Zealand's international obligations. Two of these regulations implemented bilateral agreements, three implemented a multilateral understanding, two implemented various standards and 31 implemented multilateral agreements (although many of these dealt with the requirements of the same multilateral agreement). Eighteen dealt with environmental agreements, four implemented aspects of an agreement to protect cultural property, four dealt with intellectual property, three concerned sanctions imposed by the Security Council of the United Nations, three dealt with criminal matters, three implemented an understanding regarding investment, one implemented a bilateral investment protocol, one implemented a bilateral tax agreement and one implemented a safety standard.

This level of activity is the same level of activity that took place during the previous interval. During the previous interval, the Executive made 38 regulations relevant to New Zealand's international obligations. Four of these regulations implemented bilateral agreements, three implemented various standards and the remaining 31 implemented multilateral agreements (although many of these dealt with the requirements of the same multilateral agreement). Twenty-two dealt with environmental agreements, one implemented a bilateral tax agreement, six dealt with trade, six dealt with safety matters, two dealt with drugs and one concerned land transport.⁵

2. Treaty actions

During the current interval, the Executive was involved in 22 treaty actions with respect to five multilateral agreements and 17 bilateral agreements. Of the five multilateral agreements, the Executive approved one and signed one. Three came into force. Of the 17 bilateral agreements, the Executive adhered to 23 and signed six. Twenty-four came into force.

This level of activity is less than the level of activity that took place during the previous interval. During the previous interval, the Executive was involved in 64 treaty actions with respect to eight multilateral agreements and

27 bilateral agreements. Of the eight multilateral agreements, the Executive adhered to five and signed one. Five came into force. Of the 27 bilateral agreements, the Executive signed 13. Four came into force.⁶

3. Periodic reports

New Zealand is required to provide periodic reports to the United Nations regarding its compliance with the following human rights treaties: the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights (1966), the International Covenant on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights (1966), the International Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Racial Discrimination (1966), the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women (1979), the Convention against Torture and Other Cruel, Inhuman or Degrading Treatment or Punishment (1984), the Convention on the Rights of the Child (1989) and the Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (2006).⁷

During the current interval, the Executive did not have occasion to submit a periodic report to the United Nations under one of these human rights treaties.

In terms of periodic reports, this level of activity is less than the level of activity that took place during the previous interval. During the previous interval, the Executive submitted New Zealand's 18th, 19th and 20th consolidated periodic report to the Committee on the Elimination of Racial Discrimination.⁸

4. New Zealand Treaties Online

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade marshalled its resources to launch New Zealand Treaties Online in June 2014.⁹ This searchable online database includes all treaties to which New Zealand is a party, and will eventually provide either a copy of, or a link to, the full text of each treaty.¹⁰ It provides an official record of New Zealand's international obligations and, where appropriate, provides or will provide the following information about each treaty to which New Zealand is a party: treaty code; treaty type; common name; responsible department; treaty status; treaty summary; New Zealand adherence status; adherence type; signature date; expired; date concluded; place concluded; entry into force date; New Zealand entry into force date; termination date; withdrawal date; withdrawal notification date; NZ objections; NZ reservations; NZTS number; UNTS number, associated treaties; other references; treaty text link; parties; and contact information.

C. Judicial Activity

During the current interval, the judiciary delivered 122 judgments that referenced New Zealand's international obligations. Fifteen of these judgments were reported in the New Zealand Law Report series; the Supreme Court delivered three, the Court of Appeal delivered seven and the High Court delivered five. One hundred and three were reported in other series; the Court of Appeal delivered 11, the High Court delivered 29, the District Court delivered five, the Family Court delivered 52, the Environment Court delivered two, the Employment Court delivered two and the Human Rights Review Tribunal delivered two. Four were unreported; the High Court delivered two, the Family Court delivered one and the Maori Land Court delivered one.

Of these 122 judgments, 54 dealt with custody matters, 10 with crimes, seven with immigration, six with arbitration, five with administrative law, five with employment law, five with human rights, four with environmental law, three with maritime law, three with extradition, three with legal aid, three with property, three with criminal procedure, two with customary rights, two with insolvency, two with civil procedure, one with torts, one with social security, one with evidence, one with local government and one with security for costs.

These 122 judgments referred to 38 different international instruments (three of which do not have New Zealand as a party), of which 34 are multilateral agreements and two are model laws, one concerned a commission and one is a bilateral agreement. In total, these judgments have 163 references. In these cases, the most frequently cited international agreements are the Convention on the Rights of the Child (1989) (41 references), the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights (1966) (21 references), the Convention on the Civil Aspects of International Child Abduction (1980) (18 references), the European Convention for the Protection of Human Rights and Fundamental Freedoms (1950) (13 references), the Model Law on International Commercial Arbitration (1966) (seven references), the Convention on Protection of Children and Co-operation in respect of Intercountry Adoption (1993) (six references), the International Covenant on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights (1966) (six references), the United Nations Commission on International Trade Law (1966) (six references), the Universal Declaration of Human Rights (1948) (four references), the Treaty on Extradition between New Zealand and the United States (1970) (three references), the Convention against Transnational Organised Crime (2000) (three references), the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples (2007) (three references) and the Vienna Convention on the Law of Treaties (1969) (three references). Four other instruments are referenced twice and 21 others are referenced once.

In terms of the number of judgments delivered, the level of activity is less than the activity that took place during the previous interval. During the previous interval, the judiciary delivered 128 judgments that referenced New Zealand's international obligations. Ten of these judgments were reported in the New Zealand Law Report series; the Supreme Court delivered four, the Court of Appeal delivered five and the High Court delivered one. Seventytwo were reported in other series; the Supreme Court delivered two, the Court of Appeal delivered 19, the High Court delivered 23, the District Court delivered three and the Family Court delivered 25. Forty-six were unreported; the High Court delivered 17, the District Court delivered two and the Family Court delivered 27.

Of these 128 judgments, 50 dealt with custody matters, 13 with criminal procedure, 12 with crimes, eight with immigration, eight with parenting orders, six with property matters, five with judicial review, four with civil procedure, four with constitutional law, three with extradition, three with administrative law, two with social security and two with insolvency. One dealt with contracts, one with arbitration, one with name suppression, one with compulsory treatment orders, one with service orders, one with youth justice and one with land transport.

These 128 judgments referred to 43 different international instruments (three of which do not have New Zealand as a party), of which 40 are multilateral agreements and one is a model law, one is a set of principles and one is a bilateral agreement. In total, these judgments have 183 references. In these cases, the most frequently cited international agreements are the Convention on the Rights of the Child (1989) (38 references), the Convention on the Civil Aspects of International Child Abduction (1980) (31 references), the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights (1966) (27 references), the European Convention for the Protection of Human Rights and Fundamental Freedoms (1950) (13 references), the International Covenant on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights (1966) (seven references), the Convention on Protection of Children and Co-operation in respect of Intercountry Adoption (1993) (six references), the Convention against Transnational Organised Crime (2000) (four references), the Model Treaty on Mutual Assistance in Criminal Matters (1990) (four references), the Treaty on Extradition between New Zealand and the United States (1970) (four references), the Convention against Torture and other Cruel, Inhuman or Degrading Treatment or Punishment (1984) (three references) and the Model Law on International Commercial Arbitration (1985) (three references). Eleven other instruments are referenced twice and 21 others are referenced once.

D. Conclusion

During the current interval, each of the three branches of government contributed to the implementation of New Zealand's international obligations. The level of activity for the current interval decreased relative to the previous interval for Parliament, the Executive and the Judiciary. Nevertheless, international agreements are still a significant source of law in New Zealand.

II. TREATY ACTION

This Part sets out the treaty actions taken by the Executive during the current interval. It lists the agreements that New Zealand has signed, ratified, accepted, approved, or acceded to, or that entered into force for New Zealand. It also sets out the reports on treaties that the Executive tabled in the House during the current interval.

2. Reports Where Matters Were Drawn to the Attention of the House

International treaty examination of the Protocol to the 2007 World Wine Trade Group agreement on requirements for wine labelling: Concerning alcohol tolerance, vintage, variety, and wine regions, Brussels, 22 March 2013; Foreign Affairs, Defence and Trade Committee (13 June 2013):

The Committee noted that ratification of the Protocol would not affect New Zealand's ability to place alcohol health warnings on wine bottles.

International treaty examination of the Convention between Japan and New Zealand for the Avoidance of Double Taxation and the Prevention of Fiscal Evasion with Respect to Taxes on Income; Foreign Affairs, Defence and Trade Committee (28 March 2013):

The Committee noted that the Convention replaces an existing agreement with an updated version. It aims to reduce tax barriers for New Zealand businesses with operations in Japan and for Japanese businesses with operations in New Zealand. Its main benefit is to provide investment

certainty: for example, a Japanese investor could determine the tax implications of investing in New Zealand by referring to the text of the agreement instead of the relevant New Zealand and Japanese legislation.

International treaty examination of the Agreement between the Government of New Zealand and the Government of Niue on the Exchange of Information with Respect to Taxes; Foreign Affairs, Defence and Trade Committee (22 February 2013):

The Committee noted that Niue is seeking to improve its international standing by concluding exchange of information agreements with other countries to demonstrate that is no longer a tax haven. As New Zealand is Niue's largest economic partner, Niue approached New Zealand first. The agreement will have minimal benefits for New Zealand as New Zealand is unlikely to need to request much tax information from Niue. Safeguards are in place to discourage any mishandling of information supplied by New Zealand to Niue.

International treaty examination of the United Nations Industrial Development Organization (UNIDO); Foreign Affairs, Defence and Trade Committee (30 November 2012):

The Committee notes that the Government proposes to withdraw from UNIDO. The majority of the Committee supports the proposal because the role of UNIDO in the international aid system is marginal and its relevance to New Zealand's aid priorities has declined. A minority of the Committee opposes the proposal because the decision to withdraw from UNIDO is counterproductive in strategic terms, casts doubts on New Zealand's international standing and is based on poor methodology.

International Treaty Examinations of the Amendment of the Agreement Establishing the European Bank for Reconstruction and Development to Enable the Bank to Operate in Countries of the Southern and Eastern Mediterranean and the Amendment of the Agreement Establishing the European Bank for Reconstruction and Development to Allow the Use of Special Funds in Recipient Countries and Potential Recipient Countries; Foreign Affairs, Defence and Trade Committee (14 September 2012):

The Committee noted that New Zealand ratified the Agreement in 1991 and that Bank has the current goal of facilitating the transition toward open market economies and to encourage private-sector investment in Central and Eastern Europe. The amendments allow the Bank to operate in North Africa and the Middle East. Complying with the amendments, which is costless, reaffirms New Zealand's commitment to the economic reform and development of these regions. International treaty examination of the Convention between New Zealand and Canada for the Avoidance of Double Taxation and the Prevention of Fiscal Evasion with Respect to Taxes on Income; Finance and Expenditure Committee (3 August 2012):

The Committee noted that the Convention replaces an existing agreement with Canada to reflect international developments and changes in policy. The main change is the reduction of withholding tax rates on dividends, interest and royalties in line with New Zealand's wider strategy on treaty withholding tax rates. Labour members of the Committee noted that overseas investors do not receive the full range of government services paid for out of taxes but because they do receive some benefits they should pay some tax, albeit at lower rates.

III. LEGISLATION RELATED TO NEW ZEALAND'S INTERNATIONAL OBLIGATIONS

This Part sets out the legislation dealt with during the current interval that concerns New Zealand's international obligations. It is divided into two sections, the first listing the Acts that were enacted and the second listing the regulations that were made.

A. Acts of Parliament

Acts of Parliament relating to New Zealand's international obligations are identified as: (1) Acts simply amending legislation that has implemented treaties; (2) Acts improving compliance with treaties that have already been implemented; or (3) Acts implementing new treaty obligations.

1. Acts Simply Amending Legislation that Implemented Treaties

Anti-Money Laundering and Countering Financing of Terrorism Amendment Act 2012

This Act amends the Anti-Money Laundering and Countering Financing of Terrorism Act 2009, which implements various recommendations of the Financial Action Task Force (established 1989).

Births, Deaths, Marriages, and Relationships Registration Amendment Act 2013

This Act amends the Births, Deaths, Marriages, and Relationships Registration Act 1995, which implements the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights (1966) [article 24].

Child Support Amendment Act 2013

This Act amends the Child Support Act 1991, which implements the Convention on the Rights of the Child (1989).

Children, Young Persons, and Their Families Amendment Act 2012

This Act amends the Children, Young Persons, and Their Families Act 1989, which implements the Arrangement between New Zealand and Australian States and Territories regarding the transfer of children subject to child protection orders (2000).

Children, Young Persons, and Their Families (Indexation–Budget Measures) Amendment Act 2012

As above.

Commerce (International Co-operation, and Fees) Amendment Act 2012

This Act amends the Commerce Act 1987, which implements the Trans-Tasman Mutual Recognition Arrangement (1998). Among other things, the amendments allow the Minister, on behalf of the Government of New Zealand, to enter into co-operation arrangements concerning overseas regulators.

Conservation Amendment Act 2012

This Act amends the Conservation Act 1987, which implements the Convention on Wetlands of International Importance especially as Waterfowl Habitat (1971) and the Convention for the Protection of the World Cultural and Natural Heritage (1972).

Conservation (Natural Heritage Protection) Act 2013

The Act amends a number of Acts, including the Conservation Act 1987, which implements the Convention on Wetlands of International Importance especially as Waterfowl Habitat (1971) and the Convention for the Protection of the World Cultural and Natural Heritage (1972).

Continental Shelf Amendment Act 2013

This Act amends the Continental Shelf Act 1964, which implements the Convention on the Law of the Sea (1982) and the Treaty between the Government of Australia and the Government of New Zealand Establishing Certain Exclusive Economic Zone Boundaries and Continental Shelf Boundaries (2004).

Corrections Amendment Act 2013

This Act amends the Corrections Act 2004, which implements the United Nations Standard Minimum Rules for the Treatment of Prisoners (1955, amended 1977) and the Convention on the Rights of the Child (1989).

Crimes Amendment Act 2013

This Act amends the Crimes Act 1961, which implements the Convention relating to the Status of Refugees (1951) [article 31], the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights (1966), the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women (1979) [articles 3, 4, 6, and 15], the Convention on the Physical Protection

of Nuclear Material and Nuclear Facilities (1980), the Convention against Torture and Other Cruel, Inhuman or Degrading Treatment or Punishment (1984), the Recommendations of Financial Action Task Force (Task Force established 1989), the Convention on the Rights of the Child (1989), the Convention on the Marking of Plastic Explosives for the Purpose of Detection (1991), ILO Convention 182 (1999): Concerning the Worst Forms of Child Labour, the Convention on Combating Bribery of Foreign Public Officials in International Business Transactions (1997), the Optional Protocol to the Convention on the Rights of the Child on the Sale of Children, Child Prostitution and Child Pornography (2000), the Convention against Transnational Organised Crime (2000), the Protocol against the Smuggling of Migrants, by Land, Sea and Air, supplementing the Convention against Transnational Organised Crime (2000) and the Protocol to Prevent, Suppress and Punish Trafficking of Persons, especially Women and Children, supplementing the Convention against Transnational Organised Crime (2000).

Crown Minerals Amendment Act 2013

This Act amends the Crown Minerals Act 1991, which amends the Convention on Wetlands of International Importance especially as Waterfowl Habitat (1971).

Customs and Excise (Tobacco Products–Budget Measures) Amendment Act 2012

This Act amends the Customs and Excise Act 1996, which implements the Customs Convention on the Temporary Importation of Private Road Vehicles (1954), the Customs Convention on Containers (1972), the Recommendations of Financial Action Task Force (Task Force established 1989), the Protocol of Amendment to the International Convention on the Simplification and Harmonization of Customs Procedures (1999), the Free Trade Agreement between the Government of New Zealand and the Government of the People's Republic of China (2008) and the ASEAN-Australia-New Zealand Free Trade Area (2009). The Act also implements a standard for motor fuel testing established by the American Society for Testing and Materials International (ASTM D2699:79).

Customs and Excise (Budget Measures–Motor Spirits) Amendment Act 2013 As above. Dumping and Countervailing Duties Amendment Act 2012

This Act amends the Dumping and Countervailing Duties Act 1988, which implements the Agreement on Implementation of Article VI of the GATT (anti-dumping code) (1979), the Agreement establishing the World Trade Organization (1994) and the Agreement between New Zealand and Singapore on Closer Economic Partnership (2001).

Education (Student Allowances Indexation–Budget Measures) Amendment Act 2012

This Act amends the Education Act 1989, which implements ILO Convention 10 (1921): Minimum Age (Agriculture), ILO Convention 58 (1936): Minimum Age (Sea), ILO Convention 59 (1937): Minimum Age (Industry), the Convention against Discrimination in Education (1960) and ILO Convention 122 (1964): Employment Policy.

Education Amendment Act 2013

As above.

Evidence Amendment Act 2013

This Act amends the Evidence Act 2006, which implements the Hague Convention Abolishing the Requirement of Legalisation for Foreign Public Documents (1961), the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights (1966) [articles 14 and 17], the Convention on the Taking of Evidence Abroad in Civil or Commercial Matters (1970), the Convention on the Civil Aspects of International Child Abduction (1980) and the Convention against Torture and Other Cruel, Inhuman or Degrading Treatment or Punishment (1984) [articles 9 and 15].

Fair Trading (International Co-operation) Amendment Act 2012

This Act amends the Fair Trading Act 1986, which implements the UN Guidelines for Consumer Protection (1985) and Annex 14 of the Free Trade Agreement between the Government of New Zealand and the Government of the People's Republic of China (2008), which sets out the Agreement between the Government of New Zealand and the Government of the People's Republic of China on Cooperation in the Field of Conformity Assessment in Relation to Electrical and Electronic Equipment and Components (2008). Among other things, the amendments allow the Minister, on behalf of the Government of New Zealand, to enter into cooperation arrangements concerning overseas regulators.

Fair Trading (Soliciting on Behalf of Charities) Amendment Act 2012

This Act amends the Fair Trading Act 1986, which implements the UN Guidelines for Consumer Protection (1985) and Annex 14 of the Free Trade Agreement between the Government of New Zealand and the Government of the People's Republic of China (2008), which sets out the Agreement between the Government of New Zealand and the

Government of the People's Republic of China on Cooperation in the Field of Conformity Assessment in Relation to Electrical and Electronic Equipment and Components (2008).

Films, Videos, and Publications Classification Amendment Act 2012

This Act amends the Films, Videos, and Publications Classification Act 1993, which implements the Convention for the Suppression of the Circulation of, and Traffic in, Obscene Publications (1923), the Protocol to amend the Convention for the Suppression of the Circulation of, and Traffic in, Obscene Publications (1947), the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights (1966) [articles 3, 15, and 19], the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women (1979) [article 5], ILO Convention 182 (1999): Worst Forms of Child Labour and the Optional Protocol to the Convention on the Rights of the Child on the Sale of Children, Child Prostitution and Child Pornography (2000).

Fisheries Amendment Act 2012

This Act amends the Fisheries Act 1996, which implements the Agreement for the Implementation of the Provisions of the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea of 10 December 1982 relating to the Conservation and Management of Straddling Fish Stocks and Highly Migratory Fish Stocks (1982) and the United Nations Fish Stocks Agreement (1995).

Holidays (Full Recognition of Waitangi Day and ANZAC Day) Amendment Act 2013

This Act amends the Holidays Act 2003, which implements ILO Convention 52 (1936): Holidays with Pay and ILO Convention 101 (1952): Holidays with Pay (Agriculture).

Immigration Amendment Act 2013

This Act amends the Immigration Act 2009, which implements the ILO Convention 97 (1949): Migration for Employment, the Convention relating to the Status of Refugees (1951), the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights (1966), the Protocol relating to the Status of Refugees (1967), the Convention Against Torture and Other Cruel, Inhuman and Degrading Treatment or Punishment (1984), the Convention against Transnational Organised Crime (2000), the Protocol against the Smuggling of Migrants, by Land, Sea and Air, supplementing the Convention against Transnational Organised Crime (2000) and the Protocol to Prevent, Suppress and Punish Trafficking of Persons, especially Women and Children, supplementing the Convention against Transnational Organised Transnational Organiset Convention against Transnational Organised Crime (2000).

Local Electoral Amendment Act 2013

This Act amends the Local Electoral Act 2001, which implements the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights (1966) [articles 21 and 25] and the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women (1979) [Part I and article 7].

Marriage (Definition of Marriage) Amendment Act 2013

This Act amends the Marriage Act 1955, which implements the Convention relating to the Status of Refugees (1951) [article 12], the International Covenant on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights (1966) [article 10], the Convention on the Rights of the Child (1989) and the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women (1979) [article 16].

Misuse of Drugs Amendment Act 2013

This Act amends the Misuse of Drugs Act 1975, which implements the Single Convention on Narcotic Drugs (1961), the Convention on Psychotropic Substances (1971), the Protocol to the Single Convention on Narcotic Drugs (1972), the Convention on the Physical Protection of Nuclear Material and Nuclear Facilities (1980), the Convention against Illicit Traffic in Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (1988), the Recommendations of Financial Action Task Force (Task Force established 1989) and the Convention on the Marking of Plastic Explosives for the Purpose of Detection (1991).

Prisoners' and Victims' Claims (Continuation and Reform) Amendment Act 2013

This Act amends the Prisoners' and Victims' Claims Act 2005, which implements the Universal Declaration of Human Rights (1948), the Convention relating to the Status of Refugees (1951), the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Racial Discrimination (1963), the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights (1966), the Optional Protocol to the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights (1966) and the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women (1979).

Privacy Amendment Act 2013

This Act amends the Privacy Act 1993, which implements various aspects of the Recommendation of the Council of the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development Concerning the Protection of Privacy and Transborder flows of Personal Data (1980).

Radiocommunications Amendment Act 2012

This Act amends the Radiocommunications Act 1989, which implements the Convention on International Civil Aviation (1944), the International Convention for the Safety of Life at Sea (1974), the Radio Regulations annexed to the International Telecommunication Convention (1982) and Annex 14 of the Free Trade Agreement between the Government of New Zealand and the Government of the People's Republic of China (2008), which sets out the Agreement between the Government of New Zealand and the Government of the People's Republic of China on Cooperation in the Field of Conformity Assessment in Relation to Electrical and Electronic Equipment and Components (2008).

Sentencing (Aggravating Factors) Amendment Act 2012

This Act amends the Sentencing Act 2002, which implements the Convention on the Physical Protection of Nuclear Material and Nuclear Facilities (1980) and the Convention on the Marking of Plastic Explosives for the Purpose of Detection (1991).

- Social Security (Benefit Categories and Work Focus) Amendment Act 2013 This Act amends the Social Security Act 1964, which implements ILO Convention 44 (1934): Unemployment Provision, ILO Convention 122 (1964): Employment Policy, and the Convention on Social Security between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of New Zealand (1969).
- Social Security (Indexation–Budget Measures) Amendment Act 2012 As above.
- Social Security (Youth Support and Work Focus) Amendment Act 2012 As above.

Summary Offences (Alcohol Reform) Amendment Act 2012

This Act amends the Summary Offences Act 1981, which implements the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights (1966) [articles 14, 17, 19, and 21].

Telecommunications (International Co-operation) Amendment Act 2012

This Act amends the Telecommunications Act 2001, which implements the International Telecommunication Convention with Annexes, Final Protocol, and Additional Protocols I to VII, and Annexed Radio Regulations (1932) and the Constitution of the Asia–Pacific Telecommunity (1979).

2. Acts Improving Compliance with Treaties Already Implemented

Climate Change Response (Emissions Trading and Other Matters) Amendment Act 2012

This Act amends the Climate Change Response Act 2002, which implements the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (1992) and the Kyoto Protocol to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (1997). The amendments modify the emissions trading scheme.

Conservation Amendment Act 2013

This Act amends the Conservation Act 1987, which implements the Convention on Wetlands of International Importance especially as Waterfowl Habitat (1971) and the Convention for the Protection of the World Cultural and Natural Heritage (1972). The amendment inserts a definition of the RAMSAR Secretariat into the principal Act, which is the body responsible for co-ordination of the Convention on Wetlands of International Importance especially as Waterfowl Habit (1971).

International Finance Agreements Amendment Act 2013

This Act amends the International Finance Agreements Act 1961, which implements the Articles of Agreement of the International Monetary Fund (1945), the Articles of Agreement of the International Finance Corporation (1945), the Articles of Agreement of the International Finance Corporation (1955), the Resolution of Board of Governors Setting Forth the Terms and Conditions Governing Admission to Membership in the International Monetary Fund (1961), the Resolution of Board of Governors Setting Forth the Terms and Conditions Governing Admission to Membership in the International Bank for Reconstruction and Development (1961), the Resolution of Board of Governors Setting Forth the Terms and Conditions Governing Admission to Membership in the International Finance Corporation (1961) and the Convention Establishing the Multilateral Investment Guarantee Agency (1985). The amendments adjust Schedule 1 of the principal Act, which sets out the Articles of Agreement of the International Monetary Fund, in the light of reforms adopted in 2008. They also adjust Schedule 2 of the principal Act, which sets out the Articles of Agreement of the International Bank for Reconstruction and Development, in the light of reforms adopted in 2010. In addition, the amendments add a new s 10 to the principal Act that allows the Schedules of the principal Act, which set out the relevant international agreements, to be kept up to date by Order in Council.

Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012

This Act replaces the Sale of Liquor Act 1989, which implements the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights (1966) [article 14] and ILO Convention 59 (1937): Minimum Age (Industry).

3. Acts Implementing New Treaties¹³

Antarctica (Environmental Protection: Liability Annex) Amendment Act 2012

This Act amends the Antarctica (Environmental Protection) Act 1994, which implements the Antarctic Treaty (1959), the Protocol on Environmental Protection to the Antarctic Treaty (1991), the Convention

for the Conservation of Antarctic Seals (1972) and the Convention on the Conservation of Antarctic Marine Living Resources (1980). The amendments implement Annex VI to the Protocol on Environmental Protection to the Antarctic Treaty on Liability Arising from Environmental Emergencies (2005) and aspects of the International Convention on Tonnage Measurement of Ships (1969).

Biosecurity Law Reform Act 2012

This Act amends the Biosecurity Act 1993. The amendments implement aspects of the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea (1982), the World Trade Organization Agreement on the Application of Sanitary and Phytosanitary Measures (1995) and the Convention for the Control and Management of Ships' Ballast Water and Sediments (2004).

This Act also amends the Maritime Transport Act 1994, which implements the International Convention for the Unification of Certain Rules of Law relating to Bills of Lading (1924), the Protocol to International Convention for the Unification of Certain Rules of Law relating to Bills of Lading (1968), the Convention on Civil Liability for Oil Pollution Damage (1969), the International Convention on Tonnage Measurement of Ships (1969), the International Convention on the Establishment of an International Fund for Compensation for Oil Pollution Damage (1971), the Convention on the Prevention of Marine Pollution by Dumping of Wastes and other Matter (1972), the Protocol relating to Intervention on the High Seas in Cases of Pollution by Substances other than Oil (1973), the International Convention for the Prevention of Pollution from Ships (1973), the Convention on Limitation of Liability for Maritime Claims (1976), the Protocol to the International Convention for the Prevention of Pollution from Ships (1978), the International Convention on Standards of Training, Certification and Watchkeeping for Seafarers (1978), the Protocol to International Convention for the Unification of Certain Rules of Law relating to Bills of Lading (1979), the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea (1982), the International Convention on Salvage (1989), the Protocol to the Convention on Limitation of Liability for Maritime Claims (1996) and the Protocol to the Convention on the Prevention of Marine Pollution by Dumping of Wastes and other Matter (1996).

Cultural Property (Protection in Armed Conflict) Act 2012

This Act implements the Convention respecting the Laws and Customs of War on Land (Hague IV) (1907), the Convention for the Protection of Cultural Property in the Event of Armed Conflict (1954), the First Protocol to the Convention (1954) and the Second Protocol to the Convention (1999).

Exclusive Economic Zone and Continental Shelf (Environmental Effects) Act 2012

This Act implements aspects of the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea (1982) and the Convention on Biological Diversity (1993).

Geneva Conventions (Third Protocol – Red Crystal Emblem) Amendment Act 2012

This Act amends the Geneva Conventions Act 1958, which implements the Geneva Convention for the Amelioration of the Condition of the Wounded and Sick in Armed Forces in the Field (1949), the Geneva Convention for the Amelioration of the Condition of Wounded, Sick, and Shipwrecked Members of Armed Forces at Sea (1949), the Geneva Convention relative to the Treatment of Prisoners of War (1949), the Geneva Convention relative to the Protection of Civilian Persons in Time of War (1949), the Protocol Additional to the Conventions and relating to the protection of victims of international armed conflicts (1977) and the Protocol Additional to the Conventions and relating to the protection of victims of non-international armed conflicts (1977). The amendments implement the Protocol Additional to the Geneva Conventions (1949) and relating to the Adoption of an Additional Distinctive Emblem (Protocol III) (2005).

B. Regulations¹⁴

This section sets out the regulations made during the current interval that relate to New Zealand's international obligations.¹⁵

Climate Change (Eligible Industrial Activities) Amendment Regulations (No 2) 2012

These regulations are made under s 161A(1) of the Climate Change Response Act 2002. The Act implements the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (1992) and the Kyoto Protocol to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (1997). These regulations amend the Climate Change (Eligible Industrial Activities) Regulations 2010 to adjust the relevant electricity allocation factor.

Climate Change (Forestry Sector) Amendment Regulations 2012

These regulations are made under ss 163, 166, 167 and 168 of the Climate Change Response Act 2002. The Act implements the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (1992) and the Kyoto

Protocol to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (1997). These regulations amend the Climate Change (Forestry Sector) Regulations 2008 to replace references to the chief executive with references to the Environmental Protection Authority.

Climate Change (Forestry Sector) Amendment Regulations (No 2) 2012

These regulations are made under ss 163, 167, 168 and 186F of the Climate Change Response Act 2002. The Act implements the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (1992) and the Kyoto Protocol to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (1997). These regulations amend the Climate Change (Forestry Sector) Regulations 2008 to pick up consequential changes owing to the enactment of the Climate Change Response (Emissions Trading and Other Matters) Amendment Act 2012.

Climate Change (General Exemptions) Amendment Order 2013

This order is made under s 60 of the Climate Change Response Act 2002. The Act implements the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (1992) and the Kyoto Protocol to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (1997). These regulations amend the Climate Change (General Exemptions) Order 2009 to add an exemption for the injection of natural gas into, or the extraction of natural gas from, an underground storage facility by a person who carries out the activity of mining natural gas, other than for export.

Climate Change (Other Removal Activities) Amendment Regulations 2012

These regulations are made under ss 163 and 168 of the Climate Change Response Act 2002. The Act implements the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (1992) and the Kyoto Protocol to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (1997). These regulations amend the Climate Change (Other Removal Activities) Regulations 2009 to reflect the removal of the exemption for HFC-245fa and HFC-365mfc and to prescribe criteria for registering as a participant in relation to hydrofluorocarbon and perfluorocarbon removal activity.

Climate Change (Synthetic Greenhouse Gas Levies) Regulations 2013

These regulations are made under ss 233(4), 235(4), 245 and 246 of the Climate Change Response Act 2002. The Act implements the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (1992) and the Kyoto Protocol to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (1997). These regulations amend the Climate Change (Synthetic Greenhouse Gas Levies) Regulations 2013 to prescribe the rates of the levies imposed in relation to certain motor vehicles and goods.

Cultural Property (Protection in Armed Conflict) (Convention Emblem) Regulations 2013

These regulations are made under s 43 of the Cultural Property (Protection in Armed Conflict) Act 2012. The Act implements the Convention for the Protection of Cultural Property in the Event of Armed Conflict (1954), the First Protocol to the Convention (1954), the Second Protocol to the Convention (1999) and the Convention respecting the Laws and Customs of War on Land (Hague IV) (1907). The regulations specify the form of the distinctive emblem of the Convention for the Protection of Cultural Property in the Event of Armed Conflict (1954).

Cultural Property (Protection in Armed Conflict) (Forms) Regulations 2013

These regulations are made under s 43 of the Cultural Property (Protection in Armed Conflict) Act 2012. The Act implements the Convention for the Protection of Cultural Property in the Event of Armed Conflict (1954), the First Protocol to the Convention (1954), the Second Protocol to the Convention (1999) and the Convention respecting the Laws and Customs of War on Land (Hague IV) (1907). These regulations prescribe certain forms under the Act.

District Courts (Cultural Property (Protection in Armed Conflict) Act 2012) Amendment Rules 2013

These rules are made under s 122 of the District Courts Act 1947. The amendments make a consequential change to the District Court Rules 2009 that is required by the coming into force of the Cultural Property (Protection in Armed Conflict) Act 2012, which implements the Convention for the Protection of Cultural Property in the Event of Armed Conflict (1954), the First Protocol to the Convention (1954), the Second Protocol to the Convention respecting the Laws and Customs of War on Land (Hague IV) (1907).

Double Tax Agreements (Papua New Guinea) Order 2013

This order is made under s BH 1 of the Income Tax Act 2007. This order gives effect to the Agreement between the Government of New Zealand and the Government of the Independent State of Papua New Guinea for the Avoidance of Double Taxation and the Prevention of Fiscal Evasion with Respect to Taxes on Income (2012).

Exclusive Economic Zone and Continental Shelf (Environmental Effects– Permitted Activities) Regulations 2013

These regulations are made under ss 27(1), 30(1) and 35 of the Exclusive Economic Zone and Continental Shelf (Environmental Effects) Act 2012. The Act implements the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea (1982) and the Convention on Biological Diversity (1993). The regulations state the activities that are permitted for the purposes of the Act and the conditions for undertaking those activities.

Fisheries (High Seas Fishing Notifications–Commission for the Conservation of Antarctic Marine Living Resources) Amendment Notice 2012

This notice is made under s 113C of the Fisheries Act 1996, which implements the Agreement for the Implementation of the Provisions of the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea of 10 December 1982 relating to the Conservation and Management of Straddling Fish Stocks and Highly Migratory Fish Stocks (1982). It amends the Fisheries (High Seas Fishing Notifications–Commission for the Conservation of Antarctic Marine Living Resources) Notice 2009 to update the list of international conservation and management measures that have been adopted by the Commission for the Conservation of Antarctic Marine Living Resources.

Fisheries (High Seas Fishing Notifications–Commission for the Conservation of Southern Bluefin Tuna) Amendment Notice 2012

This notice is made under s 113C of the Fisheries Act 1996. The Act implements the Agreement for the Implementation of the Provisions of the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea of 10 December 1982 relating to the Conservation and Management of Straddling Fish Stocks and Highly Migratory Fish Stocks (1982). It amends the Fisheries (High Seas Fishing Notifications–Commission for the Conservation of Southern Bluefin Tuna) Notice 2009 to update the list of international conservation and management measures that have been adopted by the Commission for the Conservations of Southern Bluefin Tuna.

Fisheries (High Seas Fishing Notifications: Western and Central Pacific Fisheries Commission) Amendment Notice 2013

This notice is made under s 113C of the Fisheries Act 1996. It amends the principal notice, which gives notice that the Western and Central Pacific Fisheries Commission is an organisation or arrangement within the definition of a global, regional, or sub-regional fisheries organisation or arrangement in Part 6A of the Fisheries Act 1996. The amendment updates the list of international conservation and management measures that have been adopted by the Western and Central Pacific Fisheries Commission. These measures apply to ships that are on the high seas in an area that the Commission covers and that are registered under the Ship Registration Act 1992 or fly the New Zealand flag.

Fisheries (Sharks-High Seas Protection) Regulations 2012

These regulations are made under s 297(1) of the Fisheries Act 1996. The Act implements the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea of 10 December 1982 relating to the Conservation and Management of Straddling Fish Stocks and Highly Migratory Fish Stocks (1982). These regulations implement a prohibition required by the Convention on the Conservation of Migratory Species of Wild Animals (1979).

Hazardous Substances (Tank Wagons and Transportable Containers) Amendment Regulations 2012

These regulations are made under ss 76(1) and 140(1)(c) of the Hazardous Substances and New Organisms Act 1996, which implements the Stockholm Convention on Persistent Organic Pollutants (2004). They amend the Hazardous Substances (Tank Wagons and Transportable Containers) Regulations 2004 to apply certain standards that comply with Chapter 6.7 of the UN Recommendations on the Transport of Dangerous Goods–Model Regulations (2011).

High Court (Cultural Property (Protection in Armed Conflict) Act 2012) Amendment Rules 2013

These rules are made under s 51C of the Judicature Act 1908. The amendments make a consequential change to the High Court Rules that is required by the coming into force of the Cultural Property (Protection in Armed Conflict) Act 2012, which implements the Convention for the Protection of Cultural Property in the Event of Armed Conflict (1954), the First Protocol to the Convention (1954), the Second Protocol to the Convention (1999) and the Convention respecting the Laws and Customs of War on Land (Hague IV) (1907).

International Criminal Court Amendment Regulations 2012

These regulations are made under s 179 of the International Crimes and International Criminal Court Act 2000, which implements the Rome Statute of the International Criminal Court (1998). The amendments make consequential changes principal regulations to account for the enactment of the Search and Surveillance Act 2012.

International War Crimes Tribunals Amendment Regulations 2012

These regulations are made under s 60 of the International War Crimes Tribunals Act 1995, which implements the Statutes for the International Criminal Tribunal for the Former Yugoslavia (1993) and the International Criminal Tribunal for Rwanda (1994). The amendments make consequential changes principal regulations to account for the enactment of the Search and Surveillance Act 2012.

Layout Designs (Eligible Countries) Amendment Order 2012

This order is made under s 37 of the Layout Designs Act 1994. It amends the Layout Designs (Eligible Countries) Order 2000 adjusts the list of countries that have joined the World Trade Organization and are party to GATT Agreement on Trade-Related Aspects of Intellectual Property Rights (1994).

Mutual Assistance in Criminal Matters Amendment Regulations 2012

These regulations are made under s 65 of the Mutual Assistance in Criminal Matters Act 1992, which implements the Convention on the Prevention and Punishment of Crimes against Internationally Protected Persons,

Including Diplomatic Agents (1973), the Convention on the Safety of United Nations and Associated Personnel (1994), the Convention Against the Taking of Hostages (1979) and aspects of the agreements set out in Schedule 1 of the Act. The amendments make consequential changes to the principal regulations to account for the enactment of the Search and Surveillance Act 2012.

Overseas Investment (Australia) Amendment Regulations 2013

These regulations are made under s 61(1)(i) of the Overseas Investment Act 2005. They amend the Overseas Investment Regulations 2005 to implement an obligation under the Protocol on Investment to the New Zealand-Australia Closer Economic Relations Trade Agreement (2011) to treat certain Australian investors as New Zealand investors.

Patents, Designs and Trade Marks Convention Order 2012

This order is made under s 20 of the Designs Act 1953, s 77 of the Patents Act 1953, and s 200 of the Trade Marks Act 2002. It updates the list of convention countries for the empowering Acts, adding countries that have signed the Paris Convention for the Protection of Industrial Property (1979) or who have joined the World Trade Organization.

Securities Act (Overseas Companies) Exemption Notice 2013

This notice is made under ss 70B and 70D of the Securities Act 1978. The notice recognises the adequacy of the regulation of securities offerings in certain overseas jurisdictions, including those jurisdictions that have regulatory bodies that are ordinary members of the International Organization of Securities Commissions (IOSCO) and are signatories to the IOSCO Multilateral Memorandum of Understanding Concerning Consultation and Cooperation and the Exchange of Information (2002).

Securities Act (Overseas Companies) Exemption Amendment Notice 2013

This notice is made under ss 70B and 70D of the Securities Act 1978. It amends the Securities Act (Overseas Companies) Exemption Notice 2013 to add Germany to a list of jurisdictions in respect of which exemptions are granted, partly because Germany is a member of the International Organization of Securities Commissions (IOSCO) and a signatory to the IOSCO Multilateral Memorandum of Understanding Concerning Consultation and Cooperation and the Exchange of Information (2002).

Securities Act (Overseas Employee Share Purchase Schemes) Exemption Amendment Notice 2013

This notice is made under ss 70B and 70D of the Securities Act 1978. It amends the Securities Act (Overseas Companies) Exemption Notice 2013 to add Hong Kong and Spain to a list of jurisdictions in respect of which exemptions are granted, partly because Germany is a member of

the International Organization of Securities Commissions (IOSCO) and a signatory to the IOSCO Multilateral Memorandum of Understanding Concerning Consultation and Cooperation and the Exchange of Information (2002).

Tokelau (Exclusive Economic Zone) Fishing Regulations 2012

These regulations are made under ss 8 and 11 of the Tokelau (Territorial Sea and Exclusive Economic Zone) Act 1977 and s 4 of the Tokelau Act 1948. It implements aspects of the Treaty on Fisheries between the Governments of Certain Pacific Island States and the Government of the United States of America (1987).

Trade Marks Amendment Regulations 2012

These regulations are made under s 199 of the Trade Marks Act 2002. They amend the Trade Marks Regulations 2003 to enable full implementation of the Singapore Treaty on the Law of Trademarks (2006), the Nice Agreement Concerning the International Classification of Goods and Services for the Purpose of the Registration of Marks (1979) and the Protocol relating to the Madrid Agreement Concerning the International Registration of Marks (1989 as amended 2007).

Trade Marks (International Registration) Regulations 2012

These regulations are made under ss 199(m) and 199A of the Trade Marks Act 2002. They implement the Protocol relating to the Madrid Agreement Concerning the International Registration of Marks (1989 as amended 2007).

United Nations Sanctions (Democratic People's Republic of Korea) Amendment Regulations 2013

These regulations are made under s 2 of the United Nations Act 1946. They give effect to resolution 2094 of the Security Council of the United Nations (2013).

United Nations Sanctions (Guinea-Bissau) Regulations 2012

These regulations are made under s 2 of the United Nations Act 1946. They give effect to resolution 2048 of the Security Council of the United Nations (2012).

United Nations Sanctions (Sierra Leone) Regulations Revocation Order 2012 This order is made under s 16 of the Acts and Regulations Publication Act 1989. It revokes the United Nations Sanctions (Sierra Leone) Regulations 1997 to give effect to Resolution 1940 of the Security Council of the United Nations (2010) to lift the arms embargo and other sanctions that the United Nations had imposed on Sierra Leone.

Wildlife (Oceanic Whitetip Shark) Order 2012

This order is made under s 7BA(2) of the Wildlife Act 1953. It implements a prohibition that was adopted by the Western and Central Pacific Fisheries Commission, which was established by the Convention for the Conservation and Management of Highly Migratory Fish Stocks in the Western and Central Pacific Ocean (2004).

Various Land Transport Rules:

Part 11 of the Land Transport Act 1998 provides for the making of rules with respect to various aspects of land transport. Many of these rules incorporate international standards or implement international obligations. The following rules were made during the current interval:

External Projections Amendment 2012 (rule 32008/2)

The rule requires that external projections on vehicles be designed and maintained with due regard to the safety of other motor vehicles, and the safety of pedestrians and cyclists. The Rule cites as an approved vehicle standard Council Directive 92/114/EEC of 17 December 1992 relating to the external projections forward of the cab's rear panel of motor vehicles of category N.

Vehicle Exhaust Emissions Amendment 2012 (rule 33001/6)

The rule, which has the aim of achieving improvements in air quality by reducing the level of harmful emissions from motor vehicles, applies to motor vehicles that are required to be certified for entry into, or operation in, service. The amendments update the required emissions standards, which take into account international best practice, including a slew of specified American, Australian, Californian, European, Japanese and United Nations standards. The Australian standards are particularly relevant because of the Trans-Tasman Mutual Recognition Arrangement (1998).

Various Maritime Rules:

Section 36(1) of the Maritime Transport Act 1994 provides for the making of rules for the purposes of the implementation of technical standards, codes of practice, performance standards and other requirements of certain conventions. Section 36(1)(u) of the Act provides for the making of rules for prescribing or providing for such matters as may be necessary to enable New Zealand to become a party to any international convention, protocol or agreement relating to maritime transport as may be recommended by the International Maritime Organization. The following rules were made during the current interval:

Maritime Rules: Part 40D–Design, Construction and Equipment – Fishing Ships–Amendment 2012

These amendments adjust many of the requirements of the principal rules, which implement the Protocol to the Torremolinos International Convention for the Safety of Fishing Vessels (1993).

Various Marine Protection Rules:

Section 386(1) of the Maritime Transport Act 1994 provides for the making of rules for the purposes of implementing New Zealand's obligations under any marine protection convention, to enable New Zealand to become a party to a convention, protocol or agreement relating to the protection of the marine environment and to implement international practices and standards relating to the protection of the marine environment that the International Maritime Organisation recommends. The following marine protection rules were made during the current interval:

Marine Protection Rules: Part 170–Prevention of Pollution from Garbage from Ships–Amendment 2012

These amendments adjust some of the requirements of the principal rules, which implement the International Convention for the Prevention of Pollution from Ships (1973), particularly the technical standards contained in Annex V of the Convention.

Marine Protection Rules: Part 200–Offshore Installations–Discharges– Amendments 2012

These amendments adjust some of the requirements of the principal rules, which implement the International Convention on Oil Pollution Preparedness, Response and Cooperation (1990) and the International Convention for the Prevention of Pollution from Ships (1973), particularly the technical standards contained in Annex V of the latter Convention.

IV. JUDICIAL DECISIONS RELATED TO NEW ZEALAND'S INTERNATIONAL OBLIGATIONS

This Part sets out the reported and unreported judicial decisions rendered during the current interval that concern New Zealand's international obligations. It divides the reported cases into those cases reported in the New Zealand Law Reports (NZLR) series in which international obligations were determinative, those cases reported in the NZLR series in which international obligations were cited but not determinative, and those cases reported in other series. It also identifies the international agreements that were referenced and sets out the distribution of these references among the various courts.
