halo effect may have been at work in the researcher's mind when she placed into a good category those rare borstal girls who had a 5th Form education, had studied at school until 15+ and were of high intelligence. Incidentally there were no specific details given about the kind of intelligence tests that were used for making the assessments of intelligence, and with the researcher's plea for the greater use of objective tests, the chance should not have been overlooked to present whatever objective data was to hand.

My final comment would be that the researcher might well have stimulated some of the positive changes that she received when in her letter to the girls six months after their discharge she used the phrase "I am sure you may be feeling differently now". She may have been right; the girls may have been feeling different, but the data would have been more acceptable had there been no leading question nor any doubt about a self fulfilling prophecy.
