
Foreword

Robert Quentin Quentin-Baxter (1922-1984)

This is the second collection of essays published in honour of the late Professor Quentin-Baxter. The first collection appeared in the issue of the Law Review immediately preceding this one. Tributes to Professor Quentin-Baxter's outstanding contribution as a teacher, lawyer and international diplomat can be found in that issue. The attention of readers is also directed to (1985) 15 V.U.W.L.R. which contains, *inter alia*, a series of articles, based on lectures delivered in a public lecture series, reviewing aspects of New Zealand's evolving constitutional arrangements. The publication of these articles provided an occasion for a tribute to Professor Quentin-Baxter in another of his major areas of scholarly and professional concern.

This issue consists primarily of articles specially written by former colleagues of Professor Quentin-Baxter — those who worked with him in both the international and the academic fields. The appropriate underlying theme is international law and constitutional law, with a focus in several of the articles on the South Pacific and New Zealand's role in that region.
