

APPROPRIATION ACT, 1868.

IN THE THIRTY-FIRST YEAR OF THE REIGN OF HER MAJESTY
QUEEN VICTORIA.

1867-8. SESSION XXII, No. 5.

*AN ACT to appropriate the revenue for the half-year ending
30th June, 1868.*

BE IT ENACTED by the Superintendent of the Province of Auckland with the advice and consent of the Provincial Council thereof as follows:

Short Title.

1. The Short Title of this Act shall be "The Appropriation Act 1868."

Certain sums applied to specified services.

2. Out of the Revenue of the Province of Auckland for the year 1868 subject to the appropriation of the Provincial Council there may be issued and applied for or towards the several services specified in the Schedule to this Act any sum or sums of money not exceeding the several sums therein respectively set forth.

Superintendent's Salary for the half-year ending 30th June, 1868.

3. Whereas by an Act of the Provincial Legislature of the Province of Auckland (Session 1 No. 6 1854) it was enacted that "Out of the Revenue of the Province of Auckland there shall be paid to the Superintendent thereof a Salary after the rate of Eight hundred pounds yearly" And whereas it is desirable for the half-year ending the 30th day of June 1868 to reduce the amount of such Salary Be it further enacted that the sum payable to the Superintendent for such period shall be Three hundred and fifty pounds

Treasurer or other person in charge of the public funds to pay money on

4. The Provincial Treasurer or other person having charge of the Public Funds of the Province shall issue and pay from time to time any sum of money not exceeding in the whole the sums respectively specified to such person and in such portions as the Superintendent for the time

being shall by warrants to be granted by him from time to warrant of time direct and such Treasurer or other person having Superintendent of the Public Funds of the Province shall in his accounts be allowed credit for all sums paid by him in pursuance of such warrants and the receipts of the persons to whom such sums shall have been so paid shall be to him a full discharge for the sums for which such receipts shall have been given and the amounts thereof shall be passed to his account accordingly.

TRUSTS.

1. Great South and Onehunga Roads : Any sums not exceeding the amount received in respect of Tolls collected thereon.
2. Great North Road :—Any sums not exceeding the amount received in respect of Tolls collected thereon
3. Mount Eden Road :—Any sums not exceeding the amount received in respect of Tolls collected thereon.
4. Auckland Harbour : Any sum not exceeding the Revenue derived in respect of the same, after payment of the cost of management and special charges payable out of the said Revenue.
5. Gold Fields : Any sum not exceeding the Revenue derived from the same, after payment thereout of the Rent and other special charges in respect of the said Gold-Field.
