1 Title

This order is the Major Events Management (FIFA U-17 Women's World Cup 2008) Order 2008.

2 Commencement

This order comes into force on 23 October 2008.

3 Interpretation

In this order,—

FIFA means Fédération Internationale de Football Association, an association founded in 1904, governed by Swiss law, and based in Zurich, Switzerland

FIFA U-17 Women's World Cup 2008 means the inaugural FIFA under-17 women's football world championships to be held in New Zealand from 28 October 2008 to 16 November 2008.

4 FIFA U-17 Women's World Cup 2008 declared to be major event

The FIFA U-17 Women's World Cup 2008 is declared to be a major event.

5 FIFA is major event organiser

FIFA is the major event organiser of the FIFA U-17 Women's World Cup 2008.

Explanatory note

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order, which comes into force on 23 October 2008, declares the FIFA U-17 Women's World Cup 2008 to be a major event for the purposes of the Major Events Management Act 2007. It also identifies FIFA as the major event organiser.
