**An Act to amend the Apprentices Act 1948**

[23 November 1967]

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

**1. Short Title**—This Act may be cited as the Apprentices Amendment Act 1967, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Apprentices Act 1948 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

**2. Transfer of apprentice to supplement training**—  
(1) Section 28 of the principal Act is hereby amended by repealing subsection (3), and substituting the following subsection:

“(3) Where the appropriate local Committee or, if there is no such Committee, the District Commissioner is of the opinion that an employer is not able to give an apprentice adequate training in the industry and that it is impossible to find another employer in the same industry and locality willing and able to undertake the obligations of the original employer, the Court, with the agreement of the appropriate Minister, may, on the application of the Commissioner made with the approval of the local Committee (if any), make an order transferring the apprentice to the Public Service, the Post Office, or the New Zealand Government Railways

Department. Any apprentice so transferred shall, during the period he is employed in the Public Service, Post Office, or the said Railways Department, be subject to the provisions of the State Services Act 1962, the Post Office Act 1959, or the Government Railways Act 1949, as the case may be.”

(2) The said section 28 is hereby further amended by repealing subsections (4) and (5).

(3) Section 70 of the State Services Act 1962 is hereby consequentially amended by repealing subsection (6).
