An Act to validate and confirm an Order in Council made under the authority of the Customs Act 1966

[21 September 1978]

WHEREAS by section 131 of the Customs Act 1966 (as amended by section 5 of the Customs Amendment Act 1973 and section 26 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act (No. 2) 1977) it is provided that every Order in Council made under section 124 or section 124A or section 125A of that Act on or after the 1st day of July in any calendar year and laid before Parliament shall expire on the close of the last day of the next ensuing session of Parliament in the following calendar year except so far as it is expressly validated or confirmed by an Act of Parliament passed during that session; and every Order in Council made under section 124 or section 124A or section 125A of that Act on or before the 30th day of June in any calendar year and laid before Parliament shall expire on the close of the last day of that session except so far as it is expressly validated or confirmed by an Act of Parliament passed during that session: And whereas the Customs Tariff (Consolidation) Amendment Order 1978 has been made partly under the authority of the said section 124 on or after the 1st day of July during the previous session but on or before the 30th day of June during the present session and has been laid before Parliament, and it is desirable to validate and confirm that order: BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. Short Title—This Act may be cited as the Customs Order Confirmation Act 1978.

2. Order in Council confirmed—The Customs Tariff (Consolidation) Amendment Order 1978 is hereby declared to be valid and is hereby confirmed as required by section 131 of the Customs Act 1966.

3. Repeal—The Customs Orders Confirmation Act 1977 is hereby repealed.

This Act is administered in the Customs Department.
