An Act to amend "The Destitute Persons Act, 1877." Title. [8th September, 1883.]

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :----

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Destitute Persons Act short Title. 1877 Amendment Act, 1883."

2. 3. No person convicted of an offence against this Act shall be Person convicted liable to any other penalty or punishment under the said Act; but not liable to other such conviction shall not prevent the making or operation of any order for the payment of money or the doing of any act by such person which may lawfully be made under the said Act.

4. Any Resident Magistrate, hearing a complaint under the Relatives may be provisions of the third and fourth sections of the said Act, shall have examined as to their power to examine on oath any near relative of a destitute person as to his ability to contribute to the support of such destitute person; and may also examine on oath any other person he may think fit for the purpose of ascertaining the ability of such relative so to do.

5. Nothing in the said Act contained shall preclude the making separate orders may of distinct orders upon different near relatives liable to contribute to be made on different the support of a destitute person, so that an adequate sum in the whole shall be paid for the support of such person, not in any case, however, exceeding a rate of twenty shillings per week.
