- Title.** AN ACT to make better provision for the rehabilitation, assistance, and protection of servicemen who have served overseas during any emergency, and their dependants. [30 April 1953]
- Short Title.** BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:
- Rehabilitation regulations.** 1. This Act may be cited as the *Emergency Forces Rehabilitation Act 1953*.
2. (1) The Governor-General may from time to time, by Order in Council, make such regulations as appear to him to be necessary or expedient for safeguarding the interests and maintaining and promoting the welfare of the persons, or of any class of the persons, who serve or have served in any of the naval, military, or air forces of New Zealand or any other part of the Commonwealth during any emergency, whether arising out of the obligations undertaken by New Zealand in the Charter of the United Nations or otherwise.

(2) Without limiting the general power hereinbefore conferred, it is hereby declared that regulations may be made under this section for all or any of the following purposes:

- (a) Providing for the occupational re-establishment of employees and apprentices:
- (b) Providing for the protection of landlords and tenants:
- (c) Providing for the protection of debtors and for the regulation and restriction of legal proceedings, powers, and remedies:
- (d) Providing generally for the rehabilitation and protection of servicemen and their dependants:
- (e) Providing, so far as appears to be necessary for the purposes of the regulations, for modifying any enactment, either generally or in its application to any specified case or class of cases, for suspending the operation of any enactment, and for applying any enactment, with or without modification:
- (f) Providing for the appropriate punishment of persons offending against the regulations.

(3) Regulations made under this section may contain such incidental and supplementary provisions as appear to the Governor-General in Council to be necessary or expedient for the purposes of the regulations.

(4) Any regulations made under this section shall have effect notwithstanding anything inconsistent therewith contained in any enactment other than this Act or in any instrument having effect by virtue of any enactment other than this Act.

(5) All regulations made under this section shall be laid before Parliament within twenty-eight days after the date of their making if Parliament is then in session, and, if not, shall be laid before Parliament within twenty-eight days after the date of the commencement of the next ensuing session.

3. (1) The Emergency Forces Act 1950 and section twenty-nine of the Finance Act (No. 2) 1952 are hereby repealed.

(2) Without limiting the provisions of the Acts Interpretation Act 1924, it is hereby declared that the repeal of any provision by this Act shall not affect any

document made or any thing whatsoever done under the provision so repealed, and every such document or thing, so far as it is subsisting or in force at the time of the repeal and could have been made or done under this Act, shall continue and have effect as if it had been made or done under the corresponding provision of this Act and as if that provision had been in force when the document was made or the thing was done.
