Title.	AN ACT to amend "The Gisborne Harbour Act, 1884." [8th October, 1892.]
Preamble.	WHEREAS by section twenty-eight of "The Harbours Act, 1878," it is provided that every future Harbour Board shall be constituted by a "special Act:" And whereas by section forty-eight of the same Act it is provided, <i>inter alia</i> , every such Board shall be a corporate body by the name of "The [stating the name] Board:" And whereas "The Gisborne Harbour Board Act, 1882," is deemed to be a special Act within the meaning of "The Harbours Act, 1878," to constitute a Harbour Board for the Port of Gisborne: And whereas by section five of "The Gisborne Harbour Board Act, 1882," the Borough Council of the Borough of Gisborne was thereby constituted a Board for the Port of Gisborne, but no name was given to the Board so constituted as required by section forty-eight of "The Harbours Act, 1878:" And whereas section four of the "The Gisborne Harbour Act, 1884," repealed section five of "The Gisborne Harbour Board Act, 1882," without giving any name to the new Board thereby constituted: And whereas it is necessary to constitute the Board created by section four of "The Gisborne Harbour Act, 1884," a corporate body by the name of "The Gisborne Harbour Board:"
Short Title.	BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:— 1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Gisborne Harbour Board Act 1884 Amendment Act, 1892."
Reference to former Acts.	2. "The said Acts" hereinafter referred to mean "The Gisborne Harbour Board Act, 1882," and "The Gisborne Harbour Act, 1884," and include any Act amending the same respectively or incorporated therewith.
Board a corporate body.	3. The Board created by the said Acts shall be a corporate body by the name of "The Gisborne Harbour Board," with perpetual

succession and a common seal, and with full power and authority by that name to sue and be sued in all Courts whatsoever, and shall be capable in law for the purposes of the said Acts to do and suffer all such acts and things as bodies corporate may do and suffer, with power to take and hold all lands, tenements, or hereditaments.

4. This Act shall be read and construed as part of the said Acts, and shall take effect as and from the date of the passing of "The Gisborne Harbour Board Act, 1882." This Act deemed part of said Acts.

5. This Act shall be deemed to be a special Act within the meaning of "The Harbours Act, 1878," which Act is hereby incorporated with this Act. This Act deemed a special Act.
