An Act to amend the Health Act 1956*[8 December 1971]*

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. Short Title—This Act may be cited as the Health Amendment Act 1971, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Health Act 1956 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

2. Advisory and technical committees—The principal Act is hereby amended by inserting, after section 9, the following section:

“9A. (1) The Minister may from time to time appoint such advisory or technical committees as he thinks fit to advise him for any of the purposes of this Act, and may from time to time determine the functions of any such committee.

“(2) There may be paid out of money appropriated by Parliament for the purpose to the members of any committee appointed under this section remuneration by way of fees, salary, or allowances and travelling allowances and expenses in accordance with the Fees and Travelling Allowances Act 1951, and the provisions of that Act shall apply accordingly as if the committee were a statutory Board within the meaning of that Act.

“(3) Subject to the provisions of this Act and of any regulations made under this Act, every such committee may regulate its own procedure.”

3. Regulations as to dangerous goods—Section 119 of the principal Act is hereby amended by adding the following paragraph:

“(d) The prohibition, restriction, or regulation, of the use, sale, or supply of any apparatus or equipment which may emit electromagnetic radiation (other than X-rays or gamma rays), and the licensing or registration of persons, premises, or things in relation to any such use, sale, or supply.”

This Act is administered in the Department of Health.
