An Act to issue and apply certain amounts of public money towards the service of the year ending with the 30th day of June 1994 and to authorise expenses to be incurred towards the service of that year

[28 September 1993]

BE IT ENACTED by the Parliament of New Zealand as follows:

1. Short Title—(1) This Act may be cited as the Imprest Supply Act (No. 3) 1993.

(2) This Act relates to the year ending with the 30th day of June 1994 (hereinafter referred to as the 1993–94 year).

2. Imprest grants—In addition to all sums otherwise granted, there may be issued and applied, by way of imprest, towards the service of the 1993–94 year, amounts of public money not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of \$600,000,000.

3. Authority to incur expenses—(1) Expenses may be incurred, in advance of appropriation, in relation to any Vote, towards the service of the 1993–94 year, up to a total not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of \$120,000,000.

(2) In addition to all sums otherwise granted (including the sum specified in section 2 of this Act), public money may be issued and applied for the purpose of meeting the expenses incurred under subsection (1) of this section.

4. Appropriation required—(1) All sums issued and applied under section 2 of this Act shall be charged in the

manner hereafter to be specified in an Appropriation Act for the 1993-94 year, and, until the Appropriation Act in which that manner is specified is passed, may be expended in the 1993-94 year as if they had been appropriated by Act of Parliament.

(2) All expenses incurred under the authority of section 3 (1) of this Act shall be charged in the manner hereafter to be specified in an Appropriation Act for the 1993-94 year, and, until the Appropriation Act in which that manner is specified is passed, may be incurred in the 1993-94 year in relation to any Vote and may be met as if they had been incurred pursuant to an appropriation by Act of Parliament.

This Act is administered in the Treasury.
