AN ACT to divide the County of Kawhia and to constitute there- Title.
out a new County, and to bring "The Counties Act, 1886,"
into force within the New County of Kawhia.

[23rd November, 1903.]

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand
in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as
follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Kawhia and Awakino Short Title.
Counties Act, 1903."

2. (1.) There is hereby constituted a new county, to be called Awakino County
the Awakino County, comprising all that portion of the County of constituted.
Kawhia within the boundaries described in the First Schedule
hereto.

(2.) The amended boundaries of the County of Kawhia are
described in the Second Schedule hereto.

3. It is hereby declared that the Counties Act shall on the Counties Act in
passing of this Act come into force within the County of Kawhia as force in Kawhia
hereby altered, but shall not come into force within the County of County, but not in
Awakino except in the manner prescribed by section eight of "The Awakino County.
Counties Act, 1886."

4. With respect to the County of Kawhia, the Governor may Bringing Act into
at any time after the passing of this Act, by Proclamation,— operation in Kawhia
County.

(a.) Divide the county into ridings, with such names and
boundaries as he thinks fit;

(b.) Fix the number of members to be elected for each riding,
but so that the number of members for the whole Coun-
cil shall not exceed nine;

(c.) Appoint some person to make up an electors roll for each
riding;

(d.) Appoint a Returning Officer and a time and place for holding the election of the first Council; and

(e.) Generally make provision for bringing "The Counties Act, 1886," into operation.

Duration of office of new Council.

5. The first Council elected in pursuance of such Proclamation shall continue in office only until the next general election of the Council as provided by section eighty-eight of "The Counties Act, 1886."

Governor may redefine boundaries.

6. Notwithstanding anything herein the Governor may at any time before the thirty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and four, by Proclamation redefine the boundaries of the Counties of Kawhia and Awakino.

Coming into operation of Act.

7. This Act shall come into operation on the gazetting of the last-mentioned Proclamation, or, if no such Proclamation is made, then on the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and four.

SCHEDULES.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

AWAKINO COUNTY.

ALL that area in the Auckland Land District bounded towards the north generally by a line along the middle of the Marakopa River from the ocean to the confluence of the said Marakopa River with the Mangapohue River; thence by a line along the middle of the said Mangapohue River to a point in line with the south-eastern boundary-line of Section No. 3, Block X., Kawhia South Survey District; thence by a right line to the south-eastern corner of that section; thence by the said Section No. 3 to its easternmost corner; thence by a right line running due east to the south-western boundary-line of Section No. 3, Block XII., Kawhia South Survey District; thence by the said Section No. 3 and Section No. 3, Block VIII., to the Kokakoroa Road; thence by that road to a point in line with the southern boundary-line of Section No. 5, Block XII.; thence across the said road and by Sections Nos. 5 and 7, Block XII., to the road forming the south-western boundary of Section No. 3, Block V., Orahiri Survey District; thence across that road and by Sections Nos. 3 and 2, Block V. aforesaid, to Section No. 5, Block X., Orahiri Survey District; thence by the said Section No. 5 to its north-eastern corner; thence by the road forming the south-eastern boundary of Section No. 2, Block V. aforesaid, to a point in line with the eastern boundary-line of the last-mentioned section; thence across that road and by the said Section No. 2 to the northernmost corner of Hauturu East B Block No. 2c; thence by the northern, eastern, and south-eastern boundary-lines of that block and the southern boundary-line of Hauturu East B Block No. 2a to the western boundary-line of Hauturu East No. 1E Block, Section No. 5; thence by the north-western and northern boundary-lines of the said Section No. 5 to the westernmost corner of Section No. 3 of Hauturu East No. 2 Block, at Kahikatearoa; thence by the north-western boundary-lines of Sections Nos. 3, 4, and 2 of the said Hauturu East No. 2 Block, by the northern and eastern boundary-lines of the last-mentioned section, and the southern boundary-line of Pukeroa-Hangitiki No. 2c Block to the western boundary-line of Section No. 4, Block XII., Orahiri Survey District; thence by the said Section No. 4 to its north-eastern corner; thence by a right line to Tahaia Trig. Station; and thence by a right line running due east to its intersection by a right line running from Kakepuku Trig. Station to Rangitoto Trig. Station, the last-mentioned line being the south-western boundary-line of the County of West Taupo; thence towards the north-east by a right line to the said Rangitoto Trig. Station; thence by a right line to the most northerly source of the Mokau River; thence towards the south generally by a line along the middle of the said Mokau River to the ocean; and thence towards the west generally by the Tasman Sea to the place of commencement.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

KAWHIA COUNTY.

ALL that area in the Auckland Land District bounded towards the south-west and north-west by Raglan County (as described in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 132, of the 15th December, 1883) from the Aotea Harbour to the Waitetuna River: thence towards the north-east generally by the said Raglan County to the south-western boundary of Waipa County (as described in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 132, of the 15th December, 1883); thence by the said Waipa County to a point in line with a right line running from Rangitoto Trig. Station to Kakepuku Trig. Station; thence by a right line to the said Kakepuku Trig. Station and its production in the direction of the said Rangitoto Trig. Station to a point due east of Tahaia Trig. Station, in Block IX., Mangaorongo Survey District: thence towards the south generally by the Awakino County, hereinbefore described, to the ocean: and thence towards the west by the Tasman Sea and the waters of the Aotea Harbour to the place of commencement.
