**An Act to amend the Local Authorities (Petroleum Tax)
Act 1970** [8 November 1974]

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. Short Title—This Act may be cited as the Local Authorities (Petroleum Tax) Amendment Act 1974, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Local Authorities (Petroleum Tax) Act 1970 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

2. Appointment of deputy of member of administering committee—The principal Act is hereby amended by inserting, after section 11, the following section:

“11A. (1) A constituent local authority may appoint any member of that local authority to be the deputy of any representative of that local authority on an administering committee (other than the administering committee for the Auckland tax area) to attend meetings of the administering committee in the absence of the member whose deputy he is.

“(2) The constituent local authorities of a combined district may by agreement among them appoint a member of one of those local authorities to be the deputy of any representative of that combined district on an administering committee to attend meetings of the administering committee in the absence of the member whose deputy he is.

“(3) Every deputy of a member of an administering committee shall hold office as such during the pleasure of the constituent local authority or local authorities by which he was appointed, and shall vacate his office if he ceases to be a member of the constituent local authority or, as the case may be, of one of the local authorities of the combined district.

“(4) Any deputy of any member of an administering committee shall, while attending as such a meeting of the committee, be deemed to be the member of the committee in whose place he attends, and the fact that he attends and acts as such at any meeting of the committee shall be conclusive evidence of his authority to do so.

“(5) Notice of the appointment or removal from office of any deputy of a member shall be given in the manner provided in section 11 (9) of this Act, as if the reference therein to a member were a reference to a deputy of a member.”
