Title.

AN ACT to enable the Mosgiel Borough Council to declare certain Private Streets in the Borough of Mosgiel to be Public Streets.
[31st August, 1926.]

Preamble.

WHEREAS the streets mentioned and described in the Schedule hereto were, with the consent of the Mosgiel Borough Council, laid out as private streets within the Borough of Mosgiel at the respective times mentioned in the said Schedule, as shown on the respective plans also therein mentioned: And whereas the said private streets have been used by the public uninterruptedly as thoroughfares since the before-mentioned times, but they have never been properly formed and constructed: And whereas the said Council is desirous that the said private streets should be declared public streets:

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short Title.

1. This Act may be cited as the Mosgiel Borough Empowering Act, 1926.

Certain private streets in Mosgiel may be declared public streets.

2. The Mosgiel Borough Council may, notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the Municipal Corporations Act, 1920, or any other Act, declare by special order all or any of the private streets mentioned and described in the Schedule hereto to be public streets without requiring that the said private streets or any of them be properly formed and constructed by the owners thereof or the frontagers thereto.

SCHEDULE.

HIGH Street and Green Street in the Borough of Mosgiel, shown on plan No. 984, deposited in the Lands Registry Office, at Dunedin, in the year 1892.

Duke Street (formerly called House Street) and Argyle Street (between Mure Street and Inglis Street) in the Borough of Mosgiel, shown on plan No. 267, deposited in the Deeds Registry Office, at Dunedin, in the year 1898.
