Title. AN ACT to amend the Noxious Weeds Act, 1908.  
[22nd March, 1921.]

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short Title. 1. This Act may be cited as the Noxious Weeds Amendment Act, 1921, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Noxious Weeds Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

Hawthorn may be declared a noxious weed. 2. The Third Schedule to the principal Act is hereby amended by inserting therein, after the reference to "Hakea," the word "Hawthorn."

Order declaring hawthorn a noxious weed may be limited to part only of district. 3. Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (c) of section five of the principal Act, a special order under section four of that Act, made by any local authority with respect to hawthorn, shall, according to the tenor of the order, be in force throughout the district of the local authority, or within such part or parts only of the district as may be defined in that behalf in the order.

Offence to plant hawthorn. 4. The planting of hawthorn is hereby prohibited, and every person commits an offence against the principal Act who propagates hawthorn in any manner, or who does any act with intent to propagate hawthorn, or who sells any seeds, plants, or cuttings of hawthorn.
