AN ACT to amend the New Zealand University Act, 1908. Title.  
[24th October, 1919.]

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. (1.) This Act may be cited as the New Zealand University Amendment Act, 1919, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the New Zealand University Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act). Short Title.

(2.) This Act shall commence on the first day of April, nineteen hundred and twenty. Commencement.

2. Section thirty of the principal Act is hereby amended by omitting the words "three thousand," and substituting the words "four thousand." Making provision for increased annual grant for purposes of New Zealand University.

3. Section thirty-one of the New Zealand University Amendment Act, 1914, is hereby amended—

(a.) By omitting from paragraph (a) the words "five thousand," and substituting the words "seven thousand five hundred": Making provision for increased annual grants for purposes of institutions affiliated to New Zealand University.

(b.) By omitting from paragraph (b) the words "five thousand," and substituting the words "seven thousand five hundred":

(c.) By omitting from paragraph (c) the words "two thousand," and substituting the words "four thousand five hundred":

(d.) By omitting from paragraph (d) the words "five thousand," and substituting the words "ten thousand."

4. In addition to the grants provided for by the said section thirty-one of the New Zealand University Amendment Act, 1914, as amended by this Act, the Minister of Finance may in each year, without further appropriation than this Act, pay out of the Consolidated Fund to each of the four affiliated University colleges the sum of five hundred pounds, to be applied exclusively to the purposes of workers' extension lectures, including tutorial classes, in University subjects.
