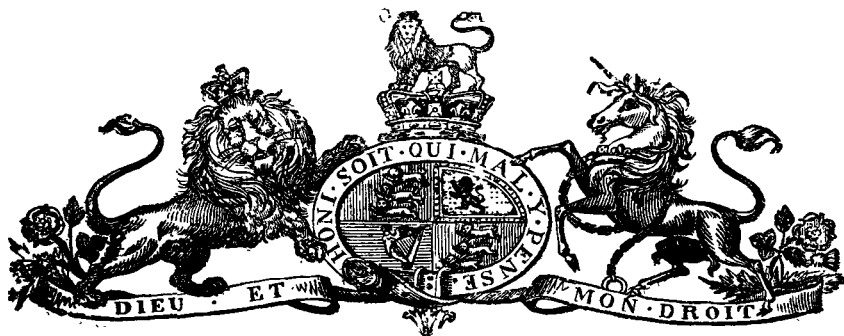

**AN ACT** to enable the Committees of both Houses of the General Assembly to administer Oaths to Witnesses in certain cases. [17th August, 1860.]

**WHEREAS** it is expedient that Committees of the Legislative Council and House of Representatives to whom Private Bills may be referred should be enabled to administer Oaths to Witnesses examined before them:

**BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED** by the General Assembly of New Zealand, in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

I. The Short Title of this Act shall be “The Private Bills Evidence Act, 1860.”

II. Any Select Committee of the Legislative Council or of the House of Representatives or a Joint Committee of the Legislative Council and House of Representatives to which any Private Bill may be referred by the Legislative Council or House of Representatives respectively, may examine Witnesses
