AN ACT to amend the Public Service Classification and Superannuation Act, 1908, and its Amendments. Title.

[28th October, 1911.]

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Public Service Classification and Superannuation Amendment Act, 1911, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Public Service Classification and Superannuation Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act). Short Title.

2. (1.) All moneys payable to the fund (other than interest accruing from investment of the fund or moneys payable thereto under section forty-nine of the principal Act, as amended by section thirty of the Public Service Classification and Superannuation Amendment Act, 1909) shall, as from the first day of January, nineteen hundred and twelve, be paid in the first place into the Post Office Account. Contributions, &c., to fund to be payable in first place to Post Office Account.

(2.) Out of the moneys so paid into the Post Office Account the Postmaster-General shall, as and when directed by the Board, pay all moneys properly payable out of the fund, and shall from time to time, on a date in each month to be prescribed by regulations in that behalf, pay over to the Public Trustee the balance of the moneys in the Post Office Account belonging to the fund, or so much thereof as the Board from time to time directs. Balance to be invested by Public Trustee.

(3.) The Public Trustee shall from time to time, at the request of the Board, pay into the Post Office Account to the credit of the fund, out of the moneys in his hands for the time being belonging to the fund, such sums as the Board directs, and the Postmaster-General shall deal with those sums in the same manner as if they had been paid into the Post Office Account in pursuance of subsection one hereof.

(4.) Except as otherwise provided by this section, all moneys belonging to the fund shall be paid to the Public Trustee, who shall from time to time invest the moneys in his possession belonging to the fund in the manner prescribed by regulations in that behalf.

Repeal.

(5.) Section twenty-one and subsection two of section twenty-nine of the principal Act are hereby repealed.

(6.) The regulations under section twenty-one of the principal Act in force at the passing of this Act shall continue in force until superseded or revoked by regulations under subsection four of this section.

3. (1.) Section thirty of the principal Act is hereby amended—

(a.) By inserting, after the words "ill health," the words "or for any other reason":

(b.) By inserting, after the words "without salary," the words "or at a reduced salary."

(2.) This section shall not apply to any contributor who retires from the public service and is reappointed thereto, in respect of the interval between his retirement and reappointment as aforesaid.

4. Section six of the Public Service Classification and Superannuation Amendment Act, 1908, is hereby amended—

(a.) By inserting, after the words "ill health," the words "or for any other reason":

Transfers to Civil
Service from other
branches of
Government
service.

5. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in section four of the Civil Service Act, 1908, and subject to regulations to be made by the Governor in Council in that behalf, any person who has been employed in any branch of the Government service other than the Civil Service for a continuous period of not less than ten years may be transferred therefrom to a similar position in the Civil Service as a permanent officer thereof.

6. Section thirty-five of the Public Service Classification and Superannuation Amendment Act, 1908, is hereby amended by inserting, after the words "entitled to count," the words "or as to the amount of any contributor's salary within the meaning and for the purposes of this Act."

Provision regarding
proposed transfer of
teachers.

7. (1.) Where an Education Board proposes to transfer a teacher from one position to another (whether in the same or in a different school), the Board shall, by writing under the hand of its Secretary, give to that teacher not less than fourteen days' notice of its intention so to transfer him.

(2.) The teacher may, within fourteen days after the receipt of the said notice, object, in writing addressed to the Secretary of the Education Board, to the proposed transfer, and shall state therein the grounds of his objection.

(3.) The Board shall (as soon as practicable thereafter) take the objection into consideration, and shall, if it decides to proceed with the transfer, give notice of its decision to the teacher, who shall thereupon (for the purpose of appeal but not otherwise) be deemed to be dismissed, and, except as otherwise specially provided by this section, the provisions of Part VIII of the Education Act, 1908, shall extend and apply accordingly.

(4.) Upon the hearing of any such appeal the Court may, in its discretion, having regard to all the circumstances of the case, either confirm the transfer or order the appellant to be reinstated.
