Title. AN ACT to amend the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908.

[Reserved for the signification of His Majesty's pleasure thereon.]

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

Short Title.

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the Shipping and Seamen Amendment Act, 1929, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

Commencement.

(2) This Act shall come into operation on the day on which His Majesty's assent thereto is notified by the Governor-General by a Proclamation published in the *Gazette*, or on such later date (being not later than three months after the date of the publication of the Proclamation as aforesaid) as is specified in that behalf in the Proclamation.

Repeal of statutory conditions to be complied with by applicants for third-class engineers' certificates.

2. (1) The following provisions relative to conditions to be complied with by applicants for third-class engineers' certificates are hereby repealed, namely :—

- (a) Subsection five of section twenty-two of the principal Act :
- (b) So much of the Second Schedule to the Shipping and Seamen Amendment Act, 1909, as relates to subsection five of section twenty-two of the principal Act :
- (c) Section two of the Shipping and Seamen Amendment Act, 1911 :
- (d) Subsection two of section three of the Shipping and Seamen Amendment Act, 1913.

(2) The power to make rules with respect to the qualification of applicants for examination conferred on the Minister by subsection two of section twenty-three of the principal Act shall, in the case of applicants for third-class engineers' certificates, include power to exempt from examination all such applicants as, by the production of certificates or otherwise, satisfy the Examiners that they are qualified without further examination to receive and to hold third-class engineers' certificates.
