AN ACT to make provision for the observance of the birthday of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth the Second. Title.
[29 August 1952]

WHEREAS Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth the Second was graciously pleased to approve of the observance in New Zealand of Her birthday in each year of Her reign on the date prescribed by or under this Act instead of the twenty-first day of April: And whereas legislation is necessary in order that full effect may be given to Her Majesty's pleasure in the matter of the observance of Her birthday: Preamble.

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Sovereign's Birthday Observance Act 1952. Short Title.

2. Where in any Act, award, industrial agreement, or other agreement, or in any order of any Court or in any other instrument of authority, reference is or was made to the Sovereign's birthday, that reference, instead Date of observance of birthday of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II.

of being a reference to the twenty-first day of April, shall, unless the context otherwise requires,—

- (a) In respect of the year nineteen hundred and fifty-two, be deemed to be and to have been a reference to the second day of June:
- (b) In respect of the year nineteen hundred and fifty-three, be deemed to be a reference to a day to be appointed in that behalf by the Governor-General by Proclamation:
- (c) In respect of every year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth the Second after the year nineteen hundred and fifty-three, be deemed to be a reference to the first Monday in June.
