An Act to amend the Sale of Liquor Act 1989

[22 May 1997]

BE IT ENACTED by the Parliament of New Zealand as follows:

1. Short Title and commencement—(1) This Act may be cited as the Sale of Liquor Amendment Act 1997, and is part of the Sale of Liquor Act 1989 (“the principal Act”).

(2) This Act comes into force on the day on which it receives the Royal assent.

2. Conditions of on-licences—Section 14 of the principal Act is amended by repealing subsection (2), and substituting the following subsection:

“(2) It is a condition of every on-licence granted in respect of a hotel or tavern that no liquor is to be sold or supplied to any person (other than a person to whom section 7 (1) (a) or (b) applies) on—

“(a) A Sunday after 3 a.m.; or

“(b) Good Friday; or

“(c) Christmas Day.”

3. Certain on-licences to be treated as permitting sale or supply of liquor during early hours of Sunday morning—Every on-licence granted before the commencement of this Act in respect of a hotel or tavern that contains a condition or statement that appears or is intended to permit the sale or supply of liquor during the period from

midnight on a Saturday to 3 a.m. on a Sunday or during a part of that period must be treated as permitting and as having always permitted the sale or supply of liquor during that period or during that part of that period, as the case may be.

This Act is administered in the Ministry of Justice.
