AN ACT to provide a Retiring Allowance to the Honourable Thomas Houghton Bartley on his retirement from the office of Speaker of the Legislative Council. Title.
[10th October 1867.]

WHEREAS the Honourable Thomas Houghton Bartley has for many years been and still is Speaker of the Legislative Council of New Zealand And whereas it is expedient to provide an allowance for the said Thomas Houghton Bartley on his retiring from the office of Speaker Preamble.

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows—

1. The Short Title of this Act shall be “The Bartley Pension Act 1867.” Short Title.

2. An annual payment of three hundred pounds sterling shall be paid to the Honourable Thomas Houghton Bartley the present Speaker of the Legislative Council of the said Colony for the term of his natural life and the said annual payment or pension shall be deemed and considered to commence and take effect from the time at which the said Thomas Houghton Bartley shall retire from the office of Speaker of the said Legislative Council with the consent of the Governor in Council and shall be paid thereafter by equal quarterly payments and the said annual payment or pension shall be payable out of and be chargeable on the Consolidated Revenue of the said Colony and the acquittance or receipt of the said Thomas Houghton Bartley or of such other person as shall be duly authorized by him to receive such payment or pension or any part thereof shall be a good and sufficient discharge for the payment thereof. Pension of £300 per annum to be paid from date of retirement.
