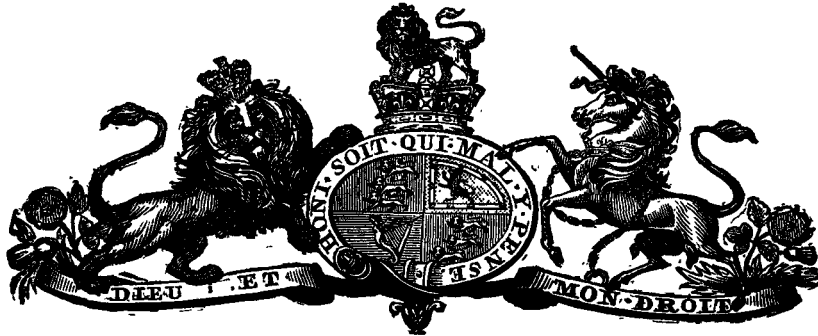

3. Treasurer of a Friendly Society to be deemed to be servant of trustees within meaning of "The Larceny Act, 1867."

AN ACT to amend "The Friendly Societies Act, 1867." Title.
[18th October, 1875.]

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act shall be "The Friendly Societies Act Amendment Act, 1875." Short Title.

2. This Act shall be read and construed with and as part of "The Friendly Societies Act, 1867," which last-mentioned Act is hereinafter referred to as "the said Act." Construction.

3. Every person elected or appointed to be the treasurer of a Friendly Society established under the said Act, or under any Act repealed thereby, or who shall act in the capacity of or be employed as such treasurer, shall, for the purposes and within the meaning of the sixty-seventh sixty-eighth seventy-first and seventy-second sections of "The Larceny Act, 1867," be deemed to be the servant of the trustee or trustees for the time being of such society; and any such person who shall commit an offence against the said provisions of "The Larceny Act, 1867," shall and may be proceeded against indicted tried and, if convicted, punished in accordance with the provisions of the last-mentioned Act, as in the case of larceny or embezzlement by a clerk or servant. Treasurer of a Friendly Society to be deemed to be servant of trustees within meaning of "The Larceny Act, 1867."

All other the provisions of "The Larceny Act, 1867," which would be applicable or extend to the case of larceny or embezzlement by clerks or servants, shall extend and apply to the treasurer of a Friendly Society as aforesaid.
