AN ACT to amend "The Immigrants Land Act, 1873." Title. [21st October, 1875.]

HEREAS it is expedient to amend "The Immigrants Land Act, Preamble. 1873" (hereinafter called "the said Act"):

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :-

1. The Short Title of this Act shall be "The Immigrants Land Short Title. Act Amendment Act, 1875."

2. In any case where any person who, since the passing of the Certain persons to said Act and prior to the coming into operation of this Act, has "Immigrants Land paid his own passage to the colony with the intention of settling Act, 1873," although upon and cultivating land therein, and who has omitted to obtain any certificate, or to do any other act by the said Act required, to entitle said Act in all cases. him to a free grant of land thereunder, whether such omission shall have occurred prior to or after arrival in the colony it shall be lawful be lawful by the said the colony it shall be lawful by the said the same occurred prior to or after arrival in the colony it shall be lawful by the same set of the set of the same set of the sam have occurred prior to or after arrival in the colony, it shall be lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, on receiving proof that such person had a bond fide intention to comply with the said Act, to direct and declare that such person shall have and be entitled to all the privileges and benefits which he would have had under the said Act but for such omission as aforesaid.

Every such Order in Council shall state specifically the nature of the omission in respect of which such Order shall be made, and shall be forthwith published in the New Zealand Gazette, and thereupon the person named in such Order in Council shall have all such privileges and benefits which he would have had but for such omission as aforesaid.
