**Title.** AN ACT to authorise the Grant to Robert Bradshaw Todman of certain Lands at Waitara, in lieu of certain Town Sections at New Plymouth to which he is found entitled, and which have been inadvertently granted to Other Persons.

[1st September, 1890.]

**Preamble.** WHEREAS the Commissioner of Crown Lands of the Land District of Taranaki, on the thirtieth day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, reported to the Minister of Lands that Robert Bradshaw Todman, late of Hackney, in the County of Middlesex, England, deceased, intestate, was entitled to the three quarter-acre sections numbered five hundred and seventy-one, five hundred and twelve, and nine hundred and fifty-four, in the Town of New Plymouth, by virtue of original land-orders of the New Zealand Company numbered respectively two hundred and thirty-eight, two hundred and thirty-nine, and two hundred and forty; and also reported that sections five hundred and seventy-one and five hundred and twelve had, among others, been granted, on the twentieth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, to the then Superintendent of the former Province of Taranaki for education purposes, and are now held by the School Commissioners of the said province for the purposes of primary education; and also that section nine hundred and fifty-four had been inadvertently sold to one George Ryan, and a grant issued to him for the same on the ninth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven:

And whereas the administrator of the estate of the said Robert Bradshaw Todman, in compensation for the aforesaid three quarter-acre sections in the Town of New Plymouth, has consented to accept six quarter-acre sections, being allotments numbered seven, eight, nine, ten, eleven, and twelve of block sixty-three, in the Town of Waitara, in that portion of the said town which was formerly called Raleigh West, and the said last-mentioned sections are vested in Her Majesty:

And whereas it is expedient that the Governor should be authorised to issue a grant for such sections in compensation as aforesaid :

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows, that is to say :—

1. The Short Title of this Act is “The Todman Land-grant Act, 1890.” Short Title.

2. The Governor may issue a warrant under his hand directing the District Land Registrar of the Taranaki District to issue a certificate of title under “The Land Transfer Act, 1885,” for allotments numbers seven, eight, nine, ten, eleven, and twelve of block number sixty-three, each containing one rood, more or less, in the Town of Waitara and in that portion thereof formerly known as the Township of Raleigh West, in favour of Robert Bradshaw Todman, late of Hackney, in the County of Middlesex, England, and his heirs ; Grant of land at  
Waitara to Todman.

And in and by such warrant may direct that such certificate shall be expressed to take effect as from the thirtieth day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven.

3. The Commissioner of Crown Lands of the Taranaki Land District shall cause the New Zealand Company’s original land-orders numbers two hundred and thirty-eight, two hundred and thirty-nine, and two hundred and forty, issued to the aforesaid Robert Bradshaw Todman, to be cancelled by the proper officer in charge thereof as satisfied, who shall append to such cancellation a reference to this Act, and sign such indorsement with his name and the date of the cancellation.
