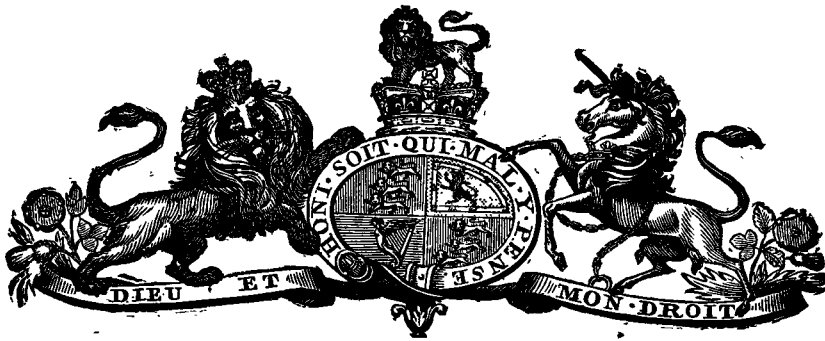

AN ACT to amend "The Neglected and Criminal Children's Act, 1867," and the Acts amending the same. Title.
[12th October, 1875.]

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend "The Neglected and Criminal Children's Act, 1867," and the Acts amending the same: Preamble.

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act shall be "The Neglected and Criminal Children's Acts Amendment Act, 1875." Short Title.

2. In lieu of the words "during the entire nonage of such child," in the twelfth line of the third section of "The Neglected Children's Act, 1873," there shall be substituted the words "whilst such child shall be under the age of twenty-one years," and the said Act shall henceforth be read as if such words were enacted therein. Amendment of section 3 of "The Neglected Children's Act, 1873."

3. The Governor may from time to time, by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, declare that any public school in which orphan children are received and educated, either wholly or partly out of public funds, shall be an Industrial School for the purposes of "The Neglected and Criminal Children's Act, 1867," or for such particular parts of the said Act as shall be mentioned in any such Proclamation; and from and after a date to be fixed in and by such Proclamation, such school shall be deemed to be an Industrial School for the purposes in such Proclamation set forth. Industrial School may be declared.
