### **APPROPRIATION (1996/97 ESTIMATES) BILL**

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

#### General Policy Statement

Appropriation is the statutory mechanism by which Parliament authorises the Government to spend public money and incur expenses and liabilities. Other than those appropriations authorised by permanent legislative authority provisions contained in other legislation, appropriations are contained in Appropriation (Estimates) and Appropriation (Supplementary Estimates) Bills.

This Appropriation (1996/97 Estimates) Bill seeks Parliamentary appropriation of the individual appropriations contained in the Estimates of Appropriations for the Government of New Zealand for the year ending 30 June 1997 (B. 5) laid before the House of Representatives as part of the 1996 Budget documentation.

In this Bill the individual appropriations in summarised form are, for the first time, set out in the First and Second Schedules to the Bill. This format replaces the previous First and Second Schedules which used to enumerate the number of each type of appropriation (for example, classes of outputs, capital contributions) each Vote contained. The provisions of the Bill ensure that the purpose of each appropriation as set out in Part B1 of the 1996/97 Estimates for each Vote forms part of the legal appropriation.

#### Clause by Clause Analysis

*Clause 1* relates to the Short Title of the Bill and provides that the Bill applies to the financial year ending with 30 June 1997.

Clause 2 is an interpretation provision.

Clauses 3, 4, and 5 are the principal appropriation clauses of the Bill.

Clause 3 seeks appropriation of public money for-

- each capital contribution by the Crown to a department or Office of Parliament; and
- each repayment of debt,-

as set out in the First Schedule.

Clause 4 seeks appropriation of expenses (and associated public money) for-

- each departmental or non-departmental class of outputs; and
- each category of benefits or other unrequited expenses; and
- each category of borrowing expenses; and

• each category of departmental or non-departmental other expenses, as set out in the *First Schedule*.

Clause 5 seeks appropriation of liabilities (and associated public money) for-

- each capital contribution by the Crown to a person or organisation other than a department or an Office of Parliament; and
- each purchase or development of capital assets by the Crown (other than by a department or Office of Parliament),—

as set out in the First Schedule.

*Clause 6* seeks appropriation of public money, expenses, and liabilities for each class of outputs (including any other expenses and any capital contribution) administered by the New Zealand Security Intelligence Service or the Government Communications Security Bureau, as set out in the *Second Schedule*.

Clause 7 provides that the classes of outputs specified in the Third Schedule are Mode B net classes of outputs. This means that costs may be incurred in relation to each of these classes of outputs up to the actual amount of trading revenue earned by that class of outputs during the 1996/97 financial year.

Clause 8 and the Fourth Schedule specify the non-departmental classes of outputs for which the Minister responsible for the Vote containing each of these classes of outputs will be required to lay a service performance report before the House of Representatives within 3 months after the end of the 1996/97 financial year. The classes of outputs listed in the Fourth Schedule are those that are predominantly supplied by providers not already required to prepare reports including a statement of service performance for laying before the House of Representatives.

*Clause 9* relates to the repeal of previous spent Appropriation and Imprest Supply Acts.

## A BILL INTITULED

### An Act to authorise the Crown to spend public money and to incur expenses and liabilities during the financial year ending with the 80th day of June 1997 by appropriating public money, expenses, and liabilities for that financial year

WHEREAS section 4(1) of the Public Finance Act 1989 provides that no expenditure of public money shall be made other than in accordance with an appropriation by Act of Parliament: And whereas section 4(2) of the Public Finance Act 1989 provides that no expense or liability shall be incurred by the Crown in relation to any transaction for which expenses or liabilities are required to be appropriated under section 4(3) of that Act other than in accordance with an appropriation by Act of Parliament: And whereas it is desirable that the Crown be authorised to spend public money and to incur expenses and liabilities during the financial year ending with the 30th day of June 1997 in accordance with the appropriations made by this Act:

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the Parliament of New Zealand as follows:

No. 182—1

1. Short Title and application—(1) This Act may be cited as the Appropriation (1996/97 Estimates) Act 1996.

(2) This Act relates to the financial year ending with the 30th day of June 1997.

**2. Interpretation**—(1) In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires,—

- "Security and intelligence department" has the meaning given to it by section 70A of the Public Finance Act 1989:
- "Shown in a Vote in the Estimates" means, in relation to any amount, shown as a figure in bold type under the column headed 1996/97 Vote Annual in the Part B1—Details of 1996/97 Appropriations for each Vote that are set out in Part B—Statement of Appropriations for each Vote in the Estimates of Appropriations for the Government of New Zealand for the year ending 30 June 1997 (B. 5):

"This year" means the financial year ending with the 30th day of June 1997.

(2) In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires, the terms "benefit", "borrowing expenses", "capital contribution", "class of outputs", "cost", "Crown", "department", "expenses", "financial year", "liability", "Mode B", "Office of Parliament", "other expenses", "outputs", "public money", and "Vote" have the meanings given to them by section 2 (1) of the Public Finance Act 1989.

**3. Appropriations of public money**—(1) Public money may be spent in relation to—

- (a) The capital contributions by the Crown to departments or Offices of Parliament set out in column 3 of the First Schedule to this Act:
- (b) The repayment of debt set out in column 3 of the First Schedule to this Act,—

which public money includes the public money that has been spent under any Imprest Supply Act passed in relation to this year.

(2) The amounts of public money to which subsection (1) of this section relates are hereby separately appropriated for the capital contribution or the repayment of debt against which each amount of public money is shown in column 4 of the First Schedule to this Act and is also shown in a Vote in the Estimates. 4. Appropriations for expenses to be incurred— (1) Expenses may be incurred in relation to—

- (a) The classes of outputs set out in column 3 of the First Schedule to this Act:
- (b) The categories of benefits or other unrequited expenses set out in column 3 of the First Schedule to this Act:
- (c) The categories of borrowing expenses set out in column 3 of the First Schedule to this Act:
- (d) The categories of other expenses set out in column 3 of the First Schedule to this Act,—

which expenses include the expenses that have been incurred under any Imprest Supply Act passed in relation to this year.

(2) Public money, including that spent under any Imprest Supply Act passed in relation to this year, may be spent for the purpose of meeting expenses incurred under subsection (1) of this section.

(3) The expenses to which subsection (1) of this section relates are hereby separately appropriated for the class of outputs, or the category of benefits or other unrequited expenses, or the category of borrowing expenses, or the category of other expenses against which the amount of each expense is shown in column 5 of the First Schedule to this Act and is also shown in a Vote in the Estimates.

### 5. Appropriations for liabilities to be incurred— (1) Liabilities may be incurred in relation to—

- (a) The capital contributions by the Crown to other persons or organisations (other than Offices of Parliament) set out in column 3 of the First Schedule to this Act.
- (b) The purchase or development of capital assets by the Crown (other than by a department) set out in column 3 of the First Schedule to this Act,—

which liabilities include the liabilities that have been incurred under any Imprest Supply Act passed in relation to this year.

(2) Public money, including that spent under any Imprest Supply Act passed in relation to this year, may be spent for the purpose of meeting liabilities incurred under the authority of subsection (1) of this section.

(3) The liabilities to which subsection (1) of this section relates are hereby separately appropriated for the capital contribution, or the purchase or development of capital assets by the Crown against which the amount of each liability is shown in column 6 of the First Schedule to this Act and is also shown in a Vote in the Estimates. 6. Appropriations administered by security and intelligence departments—(1) Public money may be spent and expenses and liabilities may be incurred in relation to each appropriation administered by a security and intelligence department for a class of outputs (including any other expenses and any capital contribution) set out in column 3 of the Second Schedule to this Act, which public money, expenses, and liabilities include the public money, expenses, and liabilities that have been spent or incurred under any Imprest Supply Act passed in relation to this year.

(2) The public money, expenses, and liabilities to which subsection (1) of this section relates are hereby separately appropriated for the class of outputs (including any other expenses and any capital contribution) against which each amount of public money, expense, and liability is shown in column 4 of the Second Schedule to this Act and is also shown in a Vote in the Estimates administered by a security and intelligence department.

7. Classes of outputs (Mode B net)—(1) The classes of outputs under Mode B specified in the Third Schedule to this Act are being supplied pursuant to section 10(1) of the Public Finance Act 1989.

(2) For this year costs may, in accordance with section 10(1) of the Public Finance Act 1989, be charged to each class of outputs listed in the Third Schedule to this Act.

8. Classes of outputs subject to section 32A of Public Finance Act 1989—(1) The classes of outputs that are subject to section 32A of the Public Finance Act 1989 are listed in the Fourth Schedule to this Act.

(2) The Minister responsible for each Vote containing an appropriation for a class of outputs listed in the Fourth Schedule to this Act shall, in accordance with section 32A of the Public Finance Act 1989, prepare and lay before the House of Representatives a report in relation to each such class of outputs.

**9. Repeals**—(1) The Acts specified in the Fifth Schedule to this Act are hereby repealed.

(2) The Appropriation (1995/96 Supplementary Estimates) Act 1996 is hereby amended by repealing sections 4, 5, 6, and 8 and the First and Third Schedules.
