A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend "The Anatomy Act, 1875."

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Anatomy Act 1875 Amendment Act, 1884."

2. In addition to the persons specified in section nine of "The Anatomy Act, 1875" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), any officer of police shall be a person having the lawful possession of any body of which he has undertaken the charge in the course of his duty, and the keeper of any asylum or establishment wherein destitute persons are housed shall be a person having the lawful possession of the body of any person who shall die therein; and in interpreting the said section neither the last clause thereof nor this section shall be deemed to restrict the generality of the first clause thereof.

3. Section fourteen of the said Act shall be read as if the words "six months" had been originally inserted in the place where the words "eight weeks" occur therein.
