A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend "The Auctioneers Act, 1891."

Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

5 1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Auctioneers Act Amendment Act, 1894." Short Title.

10 2. The words "sales by auction" or "sell by auction" shall, in addition to the meaning assigned to them in section two of "The Auctioneers Act, 1891" (herein referred to as "the said Act"), be deemed to include the selling of any property of any kind whatever by outcry in any public place, as the same is defined in "The Police Offences Act, 1884," or in any room, or mart, or place to which the public are admitted or have access, whether or not the sale of the goods has been advertised to take place, by the person conducting the sale mentioning a price for any one or more articles, and saying "I'll take," or "Who'll give?" or in any other manner whatsoever, and then disposing of one or more of such articles, or of other articles in the same or any like manner. Further definition of auction sale.

20 And the person so conducting any sale as aforesaid shall be deemed to be an auctioneer within the meaning of the said Act.
