A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend the Agricultural Implement Manufacture, Importation, and Sale Act, 1905, and to continue the Operation thereof. Title.

5 BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Agricultural Implement Manufacture, Importation, and Sale Act, 1907. Short Title.

10 2. Section two of the Agricultural Implement Manufacture, Importation, and Sale Extension Act, 1906, is hereby amended by omitting the word "seven" and substituting the word "eight." Act of 1906 extended.

3. Section nine of the Agricultural Implement Manufacture, Importation, and Sale Act, 1905, is hereby amended by omitting the 15 words "of British manufacture," and substituting the words "manufactured in the United Kingdom." Section 9 of Act of 1905 amended.

4. The Board constituted by the last-mentioned Act may exercise its powers and functions at any meeting at which the Judge of the Court of Arbitration and at least three other members of the 20 Board are present. Quorum of Agricultural Implement Inquiry Board.

5. The report of the Board shall, Report of Board to be presented to Parliament.
