A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to provide that the Judges of the Supreme Court shall henceforth be appointed for the Term of Five Years, and no longer. Title.

5 BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Supreme Court Act 1882 Amendment Act, 1884." Short Title.

2. From and after the passing of this Act all appointments of a Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the Colony of New Zealand, and of any Judge or Judges of the said Court, shall be made by a Commission under the Great Seal of the Colony for a period of five years, when such appointment shall cease and determine, and a new appointment for a like term of five years shall be made of a Chief Justice or Judge to fill the vacancy which shall have taken place. 3. No Chief Justice or Judge appointed under the authority of this Act shall have any claim to any superannuation allowance. No superannuation allowance.
