A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to prevent Plural Voting.

Title.

5 BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Abolition of Plural Voting Act, 1907, and shall come into operation on the first day of January, nineteen hundred and *eight*.

Short Title.

10 2. In this Act, if not inconsistent with the context,—  
“Local authority” means a County Council or Road Board.

Interpretation.

15 3. Notwithstanding anything in any Act, every person entitled to vote at any poll taken for the election of a member of a local authority, or on any proposal that is submitted to the votes of the electors or ratepayers of the district, shall have one vote and no more.

Elector or ratepayer to have one vote only.
