A BILL INTITULED

An Act to amend the Animals Protection Act, 1908.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as

5 follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Animals Protection Amend- short Title. ment Act, 1910, and shall form part of and be read together with the Animals Protection Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

3. Section twenty-six of the principal Act is hereby amended by section 26 adding, after the words "native game" where they first occur, the of principal Act amended. 15 words "(other than godwits)."

4. Section thirty of the principal Act is hereby amended by Section 30

adding to subsection one the words-

"Provided that the Minister may, if he thinks fit, grant permission to any person to hold native game in possession for a 20 longer period than seven days after the close of such season, but such permission shall not be deemed to authorise the killing of any native game after the close of the season."

5. Section thirty-two of the principal Act is hereby amended by Section 32 inserting, after the word "take" in subsection one, the words "any of principal Act 25 native game or"; and by adding to the same subsection the words " or for any scientific purpose."

6. (1.) Notwithstanding anything in the principal Act, the Importation Minister may from time to time, on the application in writing of any of animals for zoological gardens, person, authorise the introduction into New Zealand of such animals &c.

(2.) Such authority may be given subject to such conditions as the Minister in each case thinks fit to impose, and shall not be given unless the Minister is satisfied that the arrangements made by the applicant for the safe custody and care of any animal proposed to be introduced as aforesaid are sufficient for the protection of the public, nor unless the applicant enters into a bond or other security in an amount sufficient in the opinion of the Minister to indemnify any person against any loss or damage he may sustain by reason of the 10 introduction into New Zealand of the animals specified in the application, or any of them, or of the escape from custody of any such animal.

(3.) The provisions of sections thirty-nine to forty-two of the principal Act shall not apply in the case of any animal introduced 15 into New Zealand under this section so long as the conditions (if any) subject to which the authority was given are faithfully observed.
