A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to enable the Canterbury Agricultural and Pastoral Association to dispose of certain Lands vested in it by Public Lottery. Title.

WHEREAS the lands described in the Schedule hereto are vested in the Canterbury Agricultural and Pastoral Association: And whereas the said association has found that the said lands are not suitable for its purposes, and has acquired a more suitable site: And whereas the said association is desirous of disposing of the said lands by public lottery: Preamble.

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Canterbury Agricultural and Pastoral Association Empowering Act (No. 2), 1893." Short Title.

2. Notwithstanding anything in "The Gaming and Lotteries Act, 1881," or any amendment thereof, or any other Act or law for the time being in force relating to gaming and lotteries, it shall be lawful for the said association to sell, dispose of, divide, or allot the said lands described in the Schedule hereto by lot or chance, in such manner as to the said association shall seem fit. Land may be disposed of by lottery.

3. The provisions of "The Gaming and Lotteries Act, 1881," or any amendment thereof, or any other Act or law for the time being in force relating to gaming and lotteries, shall not apply to the purchaser or purchasers, or other the person or persons to whom the said land or any part or parts thereof shall be sold, disposed of, or allotted as aforesaid, or to any other persons who may be concerned in the sale, disposal, or allotment of the said lands. Provisions of "The Gaming and Lotteries Act, 1881," and amendments, not to apply.

4. The District Land Registrar of Canterbury shall on the deposit with him of a copy of this Act, and on production to him of a transfer or transfers from the said association of the said land, or any part or parts thereof to the purchaser or purchasers, or person or Transfers to be registered, and certificates of title granted.

persons to whom the said land or any part or parts thereof shall be sold or allotted, register the said transfer or transfers, and grant certificates of title to such purchasers or such other persons as aforesaid.

Disposal of moneys.

5. The moneys obtained from the sale, disposal, or allotment of the said land as aforesaid shall be devoted by the said association towards reducing the debt incurred by the association in the purchase and improvement of its new showground, and any balance shall be held and used by the said association for its own purposes.

### SCHEDULE.

ALL that piece of land situate in the Borough of Sydenham, containing by admeasurement 14 acres and 1 perch, more or less, being part of the Rural Section No. 239 on the map of the Chief Surveyor of the Provincial District of Canterbury setting out and describing the rural lands in the said district, and bounded as follows: Commencing at the junction of the west side of Colombo Street South and the southern side of Brougham Street, as the said streets are defined by the Government Standard Survey; thence westerly along Brougham Street 1460 $\frac{2}{10}$  links; thence southerly, by a line bearing 179° 41' 12", 950 $\frac{2}{10}$  links; thence easterly, by a line bearing 89° 54', 1478 links; and from thence returning northerly along Colombo Street South aforesaid, 956 $\frac{2}{10}$  links, to the commencing-point:
