

CANTERBURY AGRICULTURAL COLLEGE AMENDMENT BILL

EXPLANATORY NOTE

THIS Bill amends the Canterbury Agricultural College Act 1930 by providing that the person to preside at the annual meeting of the College Board for the purpose of electing a Chairman for the ensuing year shall be the Registrar of the College instead of a person specially appointed by the Minister of Education as at present.

The Bill also provides that, in the event of an equality of votes, the election of the Chairman is to be determined by the Registrar by lot; and declares that the outgoing Chairman is to be eligible for re-election.

A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend the Canterbury Agricultural College Act 1930. Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. This Act may be cited as the Canterbury Agricultural College Amendment Act 1954, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Canterbury Agricultural College Act 1930 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act). Short Title.

2. (1) Section twelve of the principal Act, as amended by section four of the Statutes Amendment Act 1944, is hereby further amended— Chairman
of Board.

(a) By adding to subsection two the words “The retiring Chairman shall be eligible for re-election”:

(b) By repealing subsection three, and substituting the following subsection:

2 *Canterbury Agricultural College Amendment*

“(3) For the purposes of the election of the Chairman, the Registrar of the College shall preside at the meeting, but shall not be entitled to vote. In the event of an equality of votes being given for two or more members the Registrar of the College shall determine by lot in the presence of the meeting which of those members is elected as Chairman, and shall thereby complete the election.”
