CAPTIVE BIRDS SHOOTING PROHIBITION.

Title.	ANALYSIS.
1. Short Title.	2. Penalty.

A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to prohibit the Use of Captive Birds in all Shooting carried on under Artificial Conditions. Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Captive Birds Shooting Prohibition Act, 1931. Short Title.

2. Every person who shall promote, arrange, conduct, assist in, receive money for, or take part in any meeting, competition, exhibition, pastime, practice, display, or in any event whatever at or in the course of which captive birds are liberated by hand or by trap, contrivance, or other means for the purpose of being shot at the time of their liberation, or who, being the owner or occupier or person in charge of any premises, shall permit his premises or property or any part thereof to be used for any such purpose, shall be liable upon summary conviction to a fine not exceeding *twenty-five* pounds. Penalty.
