## CHRISTCHURCH CITY RESERVES ACT 1877 AMENDMENT.

### A BILL INTITLED

AN ACT to amend "The Christchurch City Reserves Act, 1877." Title.

WHEREAS by the said Act the parcel of land described in the Preamble. Schedule hereto was *inter alia* vested in the Mayor, Councillors, and 5 Citizens of the City of Christchurch, for the use of the inhabitants of the said City as public gardens and promenade, subject to such rights of road or streets as now legally exist over the same: And whereas it is desirable that the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens should be at liberty to use or apply the said parcel of land as a site for the erection 10 of baths and wash-houses for the use of the inhabitants of the said City and others:

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

15 1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Christchurch City Short Title. Reserves Act 1877 Amendment Act, 1891."

2. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in "The Christchurch City Reserves Act, 1877," or any other Act affecting the parcel of land mentioned and described in the Schedule hereto, 20 or in any Crown grant or certificate of title issued therefor, it shall henceforth be vested in the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Christchurch as a reserve for public baths and wash-houses for the use of the inhabitants of the said City.

3. The Christchurch Borough Council may erect baths and wash-houses on the said parcel of land. Power of Council to erect baths and wash-houses.

Power of Council  
to lease baths.

4. If and when baths and wash-houses shall have been erected and still remain standing or being on the said parcel of land, or any part thereof, the Council may from time to time lease the same to any person for any period not exceeding seven years in possession, at such rent and subject to such terms and conditions as the Council shall think fit: Provided always that any such lease shall provide for maintaining such baths and wash-houses in complete repair during such term, and for keeping the same open to the public at proper and convenient hours during each day.

#### SCHEDULE.

ALL that parcel of land lying between Cashel Street and Hereford Street, in the City of Christchurch, in the Colony of New Zealand. Bounded on the west by Cambridge Terrace, and on the east by the River Avon.
