A BILL INTITULED

An Acr to provide for the Settlement of certain Natives in the District of Waikato.

WHEREAS tribes and persons of the Native race formerly residing on and owning, Preamble. according to their usages, lands in the district or country known by the name of Waikato, joined in the late rebellion against Her Majesty, and such lands were taken by the Crown in pursuance of the provisions in that behalf of "The New Zealand Settlements Act, 1863," and the other Acts amending and continuing the same: And whereas some of such tribes and persons have returned to their allegiance to Her Majesty, and others are desirous of so returning, and it is expedient that the Governor should have power to provide lands for their residence and settlement out of such portion of the said lands as still 10 remain unsold or undisposed of:

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:-

- 1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Waikato Confiscated Lands Act, Short Title. 1880."
- 2. This Act shall not apply to any land which has already been granted by Act not to apply to 15 the Crown, or which is subject to any contract or engagement, or to any certain land. land which under any law heretofore in existence has been devoted to any special object or has been lawfully made subject to any trust.

3. This Act shall expire at the end of two years from the passing hereof.

Duration of Act. 4. The Governor may from time to time, as he thinks fit, by Proclamation Governor may reserve 20 in the New Zealand Gazette, reserve out of any of the lands comprised in the Schedule hereto such lands as to him shall seem fit.

May grant to Natives.

5. Out of lands so reserved, he may, from time to time, grant such portions as he may think fit to such persons of the Native race as shall be proved to his satisfaction to have been in rebellion and to have subsequently submitted to the Queen's authority; or by warrant under his hand he may set apart out of lands so reserved such portions thereof as he thinks fit, for the use and occupation of such persons.

May set apart land by warrant.

6. Whenever the Governor under the above provision, by warrant under his hand, sets apart any land for the benefit of any persons of the Native race, he may, either in the same or in a subsequent warrant, specify what conditions, restrictions, or limitations shall be attached thereto, and he may subsequently 10 grant the same.

Subject to conditions.

7. Any grant which the Governor is authorized to make under the provisions of this Act may be made subject to such conditions, restrictions, and limitations as he may think fit; but domiciliary residence shall always be one of them.

Governor may grant sites for educational buildings.

8. Out of lands so reserved, the Governor may from time to time grant any 15 land as sites for buildings for educational purposes to any official person or body, or to any private persons, their heirs and assigns, upon trust for such sites only.

Schedule.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that block of land contained within a boundary, commencing at Pukorokoro, in the Gulf of the Thames; thence proceeding southward in a straight line to the Hapua Kohi Pass; thence in a straight line to the summit of Pukemoremore; thence in a straight line to the summit of Maungakawa; thence in a straight line to Pukekura; thence in a straight line to Orakau; thence in a straight line to the nearest point of the Punui River; thence following the Punui River to its junction with the Waipa River; thence in a straight line to the summit of Pirongia: thence in a straight line to the nearest point of the Waitetuna River; thence by the Waitetuna River to Whangaroa Harbour; thence by that harbour to the sea; thence by the sea-coast to the Waikato Heads; thence by the Waikato River to the Maungatawhiri River; thence by the Maungatawhiri River to the Great South Road; thence northward by the Great South Road to the Razorback Redoubt; thence by the boundary of the Rama Rama and Hunua Purchases to the Wairoa River; thence by the Wairoa River to the Northeastern boundary of the land of the Kowhairiki Tribe; thence to the summit of the Wharekawa Mountain; thence following the ridge of Wharekawa to the Surrey Redoubt; thence in a straight line to the point of commencement.
