A BILL INTITULED

An Act to validate and confirm certain Orders in Council made under the authority of the Customs Act 1966

5 WHEREAS by section 131 of the Customs Act 1966 (as amended by section 5 of the Customs Amendment Act 1973) it is provided that every Order in Council made under section 124 of that Act on or after the 1st day of July in any calendar year and laid before Parliament shall expire on the close of the last day of the next ensuing session of Parliament in the following calendar year except so far as it is expressly validated or confirmed by an Act of Parliament passed during that session; and every Order in Council made under section 10 124 of that Act on or before the 30th day of June in any calendar year and laid before Parliament shall expire on the close of the last day of that session except so far as it is expressly validated or confirmed by an Act of Parliament passed during that session: And whereas the Orders in Council specified in the Schedule to this Act have been made either wholly or partly under the authority of the said section 124 15 on or after the 1st day of July during the (*previous session*) session held in the year 1976 but on or before the 30th day of June during the present session and have been laid before Parliament, and it is desirable to validate and confirm those orders: And whereas the first 3 Orders in Council specified 20 in the said Schedule should have been laid before Parliament and validated and confirmed by Act during the session held on the 28th day of February 1977: And whereas it was not intended that those Orders in Council were to expire with that session:

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. **Short Title**—This Act may be cited as the Customs Orders Confirmation Act 1977. 5

2. **Orders in Council confirmed**—The Orders in Council specified in the Schedule to this Act are hereby declared to be valid and are hereby confirmed as required by section 131 of the Customs Act 1966. 10

New

2. **Orders in Council confirmed**—(1) The first 3 Orders in Council specified in the Schedule to this Act are hereby declared to be valid and to be in force and to always have been valid and to have continued in force, and are hereby confirmed, in all respects as if they had been laid before Parliament and expressly validated and confirmed by an Act of Parliament passed during the session held on the 28th day of February 1977, as required by section 131 of the Customs Act 1966. 15

(2) The last 2 Orders in Council specified in the Schedule to this Act are hereby declared to be valid and are hereby confirmed as required by section 131 of the Customs Act 1966. 20
