E IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:-

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Canterbury Rivers short TiNe

5 Act 1870 Amendment Act, 1880;" and it shall be deemed to be incorporated with "The Canterbury Rivers Act, 1870" (hereinafter called " the said Act").
2. Section four of the said Act is hereby repealed; but this repeal Reconstitution of the shall not affect the past operation of the said Act.
10 The members of the Board of Conservators of the South Waimakariri District in office at the time of the passing of this Act shall continue in office until the new Board constituted under this Act comes into office.

12. Any casual vacancy occurring in the Board for any of the Casual vacanciea. subdistricts shall be filled up by the Board by a duly qualified person, but any person so chosen shall retain his office so long only as the vacating member would have retained the same if no vacancy had 5 occurred.
13. During any vacancy in the Board, the continuing members vacancies not to shall act as if such vacancy had not occurred, and no act of the Board affect proceeding. shall be invalid on account of any such vacancy.
14. If a member of the Board is adjudged bankrupt, or applies to Extraordinary

10 take the benefit of any Act for the relief or protection of insolvent vacancies. debtors, or compounds with his creditors, such person shall cease to be a member of the Board, and his office shall thereupon become vacant.
15. Any person who acts as a member of the Board without being

15 duly qualified, or after he has become disqualified, shall incur a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds sterling, and in any proceeding for the recovery of such penalty the burden of proving qualification shall be upon the person against whom such proceeding is taken.

30 All books and accounts of the Board shall at all reasonable times be open to the inspection of any elector, or of any holder of the debentures of the Board, and any person refusing or obstructing any such inspection shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.
18. The Board shall hold its first meeting after election at a time Annual election of 35 and place to be fixed by the Mayor of the City of Christchurch; and at such first meeting, and afterwards annually, in the month of January in each year, the Board shall appoint one of their number to be Chairman of the Board for the year following such choice.
