A BILL INTITULED

An Act to alter the Duties of Customs.

Title

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN,—We, Your Majesty's most Preamble. dutiful and loyal subjects, the House of Representatives of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, towards raising the necessary supplies to defray Your Majesty's public expenses, and making an 5 addition to the public revenue, have freely and voluntarily resolved to give and grant unto Your Majesty the duties hereinafter mentioned, and do therefore most humbly beseech Your Majesty that it may be enacted: And be it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent 10 Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Customs Tariff Act, 1879." Short Title. 2. On and after the eighteenth day of November, one thousand Duties substituted eight hundred and seventy-nine, in lieu of the duties of Customs heretofore chargeable on the articles mentioned in the First Schedule First Schedule.
hereto, there shall be levied, collected, and paid to Her Majesty, her heirs and successors, upon the articles mentioned in the said Schedule, on importation into New Zealand, or on being cleared from any ware-20 house for home consumption, the several duties of Customs specified and set forth in the said Schedule; and the articles mentioned in the Repeal of certain

Second Schedule to this Act shall be exempt from any Customs duties duties. on the importation thereof into New Zealand.

3. The duties of Customs imposed by this Act shall be raised, "The Customs levied, collected, and paid under the provisions of "The Customs Regulation Act, 1858," and "The Customs Regulation Act Amendment Act, 1868," and subject also to all such provisions and regulations as may for the time being be in force for the collection, management, and receipt of the duties of Customs in the Colony of New Zealand; and all fines, forfeitures, penalties, and charges recoverable 30 under this Act may be recovered and applied in the manner directed by "The Customs Regulation Act, 1858," and "The Customs Regulation Act Amendment Act, 1868."

importer thereof.

6. If any person makes, or sends, or brings into New Zealand, or causes or authorizes the making, sending, or bringing into New Zealand of any invoice or paper, used or intended to be used as an invoice for Customs purposes, wherein any goods are entered or charged at a less price or value than that actually charged or intended to be charged 15 for them, no price or sum of money shall be recoverable by such person, or by any person claiming through or under such person, for the price or on account of the purchase of such goods or any part of them, or on any bill of exchange, note, or other security (unless in the hands of an innocent holder for value without notice), made, given, or 20 executed for the price of, or on account of, the purchase of such goods, or any part of such price; and the production or proof of the existence of any other invoice, account, document, or paper made or sent by the same person, or by his authority, wherein the same goods or any of them are charged or entered at or mentioned as bearing a greater 25 price than that set upon them in any such invoice as first above mentioned, shall be prima facie evidence that such first-mentioned invoice was intended to be fraudulently used for Customs purposes; but such intention, or the actual fraudulent use of such invoice, may be proved by any other legal evidence.

7. Subject to the provisions of "The Drawbacks Act, 1872," and "The Drawbacks Act Amendment Act, 1873," a drawback of the duties paid on any of the goods specified in the First Schedule of "The Drawbacks Act Amendment Act, 1873," may be paid and allowed on the exportation of such goods to any port or place out of 35 New Zealand, in the same proportion to the rates of duties for the time being payable under this or any Act hereafter to be passed for altering the duties of Customs as the rates specified in that Schedule bore to the duties chargeable at the time of the passing of "The Drawbacks Act Amendment Act, 1873."

8. The provision contained in the ninth section of "The Customs Tariff Act, 1866," so far as it applies to holloware, hardware, and ironmongery, is hereby repealed.
