DENTISTS AMENDMENT.

A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend the Dentists Act, 1908.

Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Dentists Amendment Act, 1910, and shall form part of and be read together with the Dentists Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

Short Title.

2. (1.) Notwithstanding anything in the principal Act, any person who on the tenth day of January, nineteen hundred and five (being the date of the coming into operation of the Dentists Act, 1904), was a bona fide apprentice or pupil of a person registered under the Dentists Act, 1880, and who either has been examined by a Board of Examiners appointed in accordance with the law as it existed immediately prior to the commencement of the Dentists Act, 1904, and received from such Board a certificate that he has passed such examination, or is hereafter examined by and receives a certificate from such Board that he has passed such examination, shall be entitled to be registered as a dentist upon fulfilling such other conditions as would if the last-mentioned Act had not been passed have entitled him to be so registered.

Section 11 of principal Act amended.

(2.) For the purposes of this section the Dentists Act, 1880, shall be deemed to be in force as if neither the Dentists Act, 1904, nor the principal Act had been passed, but no application for registration in pursuance of this section made after the first day of January, nineteen hundred and twelve, shall be entertained.
