A BILL to disqualify members of the House of Representatives and Provincial Councils from holding certain Offices connected with the administration of Justice. Title.

WHEREAS it is expedient that Members of the House of Representatives and Provincial Councils should be disqualified from holding certain offices connected with the administration of Justice, Preamble.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of New Zealand, as follows.

1. That no person being a Member of the House of Representatives of New Zealand, or of a Provincial Council of any Province of New Zealand, shall, during the time of his being any such Member, be capable of being a Judge of the Supreme Court, a Registrar or Deputy-Registrar of the Supreme Court, or a Sheriff, or a Resident Magistrate, or a Commissioner of a Court of Requests. No member of House of Representatives or Provincial Councils to hold certain offices connected with the administration of justice.

2. This Act shall commence and take effect from and after the day or date on which the now present General Assembly shall be dissolved by the Governor of New Zealand, or cease and determine by operation of law. Commencement of Act

3. This Act shall be entitled and may be cited as the "Disqualification Act, 1856." Short title.
