A BILL INTITULED

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New 5 Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:-

finance for purposes of development. such sums as the Council may require from time to time. The said Commissioners are hereby authorized to make such advances upon the following conditions, viz.:—

(a) Any advance may be made for a term of not less than one year and not more than three years from the date of such advance:

(b) A rate of interest not exceeding two and one-half per centum per annum shall be charged in respect of any advance:

(c) The total sum advanced shall not at any time 10 exceed the amount of any loan duly authorized for the purposes hereinbefore mentioned, less any sum for the time being actually raised by the Council out of such loan.

3. All sums advanced by the said Commissioners 15 pursuant to section two hereof shall constitute a debt due by the Council to the said Commissioners. The Council shall repay such advances on the due date thereof out of any one or more of the following sources—namely, (a) the general revenues of the city, (b) moneys accruing from the sale of lands being developed, and (c) any loanmoneys raised pursuant to the above-mentioned Act.

4. Advances received by the Council from the said Commissioners pursuant to the authority hereinbefore contained shall be excluded from the computation of the 25 overdraft limit prescribed by section three of the Local Bodies' Finance Act, 1921–22.
