A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to define and regulate the Hours of Labour within the Colony of New Zealand. Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand, in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Eight Hours Act, 1884." Short Title.
2. From and after the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, the following regulation for defining the hours of labour shall take effect within the colony :—
10 Eight hours shall constitute a legal day's work, and forty-eight hours a legal week's work. Regulation of working hours.
Eight hours a legal day, and forty-eight hours a legal week's work.
