A BILL to repeal certain Laws relating to Elections in New Zealand.

WHEREAS the law relating to the Election of Members of the House of Representatives, and of Superintendents of Provinces, and Members of Provincial Councils, requires amendment; and it is expedient that all such laws as are hereinafter specified, should be repealed, and other provisions made in lieu thereof.

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

I. So much of Section 4 as relates to the qualification of voters for the Election of Superintendents of Provinces, and Sections 5, 6, 7, 8, 41, and 42, of the Constitution Act are hereby repealed.

II. The Proclamation, bearing date the 5th day of March, 1853, given under the hand of Sir George Grey, the Governor of the Islands of New Zealand, and issued under the Public Seal of

thereof, relating to the Election of Members of the House of Representatives, and of Superintendents of Provinces, and Members of Provincial Councils, is hereby repealed.

Commencement of Act III. This Act shall come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1859.

Short Title. IV. This Act may, for all purposes, be cited as "The Electoral Laws Repeal Act, 1858."
