

EMERGENCY REGULATIONS AMENDMENT BILL

EXPLANATORY NOTE

THIS Bill extends the duration of the remaining emergency regulations for a further year, that is, to the end of 1955.

The Bill repeals the references to the regulations specified in the First Schedule, which have already been revoked.

The regulations that are to remain in force are specified in the Second Schedule. The Patents, Designs, Trade Marks, and Copyright Emergency Regulations 1940 and their amendments will be revoked by section 119 (2) of the Patents Act 1953 when that Act is brought into force by Proclamation.

A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend the Emergency Regulations Act 1939. Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority
5 of the same, as follows:

1. This Act may be cited as the Emergency Regulations Amendment Act 1954, and shall be read
together with and deemed part of the Emergency Regulations Act 1939 (hereinafter referred to as the
10 principal Act). Short Title.

2. The Second Schedule to the Emergency Regulations Continuance Act 1947 is hereby amended as from
the thirty-first day of December, nineteen hundred and fifty-four, by repealing so much thereof as relates to the
15 regulations specified in the First Schedule to this Act (being regulations that have been revoked by other
enactments). Emergency regulations revoked by other enactments.

3. The emergency regulations specified in the Second Schedule to this Act, unless they are sooner revoked by
20 the Governor-General in Council or by any Act, shall continue in force until the thirty-first day of December,
nineteen hundred and fifty-five, and shall then expire. Emergency regulations continued in force.

4. The Emergency Regulations Amendment Act 1953 is hereby repealed. Repeal.
