A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend the Factories Act, 1908.

Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Factories Amendment Act, 1916, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Factories Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act). Short Title.

2. (1.) An Inspector of Factories may require the occupier of any factory, within a time to be specified in the requisition, to provide such heating-appliances as the Inspector thinks necessary for the comfort of the persons employed in that factory. Inspector of Factories may require occupier of factory to supply heating-appliances

(2.) The provisions of section sixty-six of the principal Act (relating to requisitions under that Act) shall apply in all respects to requisitions under this section. 15
