A BILL INTITULED

An Act to amend the Government Advances to Settlers Act, Title. 1908.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand 5 in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:-

1. This Act may be cited as the Government Advances to Short Title. Settlers Amendment Act, 1908, and shall form part of and be read together with the Government Advances to Settlers Act, 1908 10 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

2. Section nineteen of the principal Act is hereby amended by Section 19 of omitting the words "five million pounds," and substituting in lieu amended.

thereof the words "six million pounds."

3. Section fifty of the principal Act is hereby amended by Section 50 of 15 omitting the words "two hundred thousand pounds," and sub-principal Act amended. stituting the words "five hundred thousand pounds."

4. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in sections sixty- Mortgage of leases four and sixty-five of the Land for Settlements Act, 1908, it shall be under Land for Settlements Act. lawful for a lessee of land under that Act to mortgage his lease to the 20 Government Advances to Settlers Office Superintendent under the provisions of the principal Act at any time after the grant of the lease and without the recommendation of the Land Board or the approval of the Minister of Lands, and advances may be made under the principal Act on the security of any such lease accordingly.

5. Nothing in section eighty-seven of the Land Act, 1908, shall Mortgage of leases under Land Act. apply so as to prevent any lessee or licensee of land subject to that Act from mortgaging his lease or license to the Government Advances to Settlers Office Superintendent under the provisions of the principal Act, although the lease or license has been current for

30 a shorter period than twelve months.
